Auto Hosts One-Sixth as Great as U. S. Population



IT is a far cry from the full skirts, hoop skirts and leg o' mutton sleeves of twenty-five years ago, but we have traversed also a long way from the two-wheeled gas wagon of 1885 to the high-powered motor speeding over our highways today. In the United States there was one automobile for every 9,500 people in the United States. Ten years ago there was one automobile for every 25 people, while today the motor population is one-sixth as large as the human population, or one car to every six people. This rapid growth has put the automobile as foremost among American industries but it has also produced a fearful menace to the public, pointing out the safety Council which has for its purpose the prevention of automobile accidents. A vigorous campaign of public education must be pushed if annual rate of automobile fatalities is to be reduced to 22,000.

YOUTH KILLED IN A FALL FROM A WAGON

Evidently losing his balance while attempting to apply the brake while descending a steep grade Thomas R. Wingard, 14 year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Wingard, residing on a farm near Salix, fell from a wagon along the Salix and Elgin brick road and was instantly killed on Thursday last. His skull was fractured and he also suffered a broken neck.
The lifeless body of the Wingard boy was found by passing motorists lying beneath one of the wagon wheels the victim having been dragged a distance of several yards. The team of horses which young Wingard was driving, did not run away when the youth fell from the wagon but pulled to the side of the roadway and stopped.
Discovery of the accident was made by James Elsenbier and a young man named McKay, both of DuBois, who were passing in a car. After extricating the Wingard boy from beneath the wagon, the men immediately summoned medical assistance, but life was found to be extinct.
Deputy Coroner Russell Yeast was notified and gave permission to remove the body from the scene of the accident.

The remains were taken to the late home of the boy and the funeral was held on Sunday afternoon in the Methodist church, with burial in Dunsmuir cemetery.
The Wingard boy had been excused from school on the day of the accident so that he could help his father with the farm work. He was engaged in hauling lime when he met his terrible fate.
Thomas Blaine Wingard was born in Salix on May 2, 1911. He was a pupil in the eighth grade of the public schools at that place. Besides his parents he is survived by the following brothers and sisters: Cora, wife of Clarence Corbin, of Salix, and Esther and Ray, both at home.
