POULTRY FACTS

FEEDING TURKEY POULTS PROPERLY
It is very poor economy to stint turkeys, especially young growing stock; for when once stunted, it takes a long while to recover.

Young chicks relish occasional feeds of cracked wheat and wheat screenings, while rice, well boiled, is not only greedily eaten by the chicks, but is one of the very best things that can be given. It frequently happens that damaged lots of rice, or low grades of it, can be bought at low figures in the cities.

Green food is very essential in stimulating egg production.
Early-hatched chicks will get a good start before hot weather and mature before winter.

Resting chicks on fresh ground away from the farm flock lessens the danger of disease.
The mature pullets can be held back by withdrawing all mash and feeding only grains, and this sparingly.

Arrange the poultry breeding pens. A few more dollars spent for a high-grade rooster will be a good investment.
Resting and hardening the chicks before they are taken from the incubator makes stronger, sturdier stock.

Feed a dry mash and green feed so the hens will always have something to peck at without troubling the eggs.
