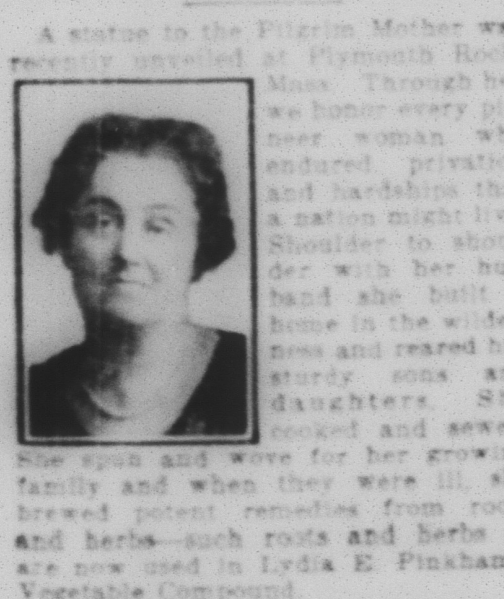


HOW THE PILGRIM MOTHER Kept Her Family in Good Health

POULTRY LAYERS SHOULD NOT BE TOO FAT

The skilled breeder tries to get his laying hens to consume the greatest amount of feed possible. That is, the greatest amount of feed which chickens will use in the production of eggs to the most profitable. Therefore, any extra amounts, either by the amount of feed or by the amount of labor, will not pay. You should feed what your hens will clean up without getting fat. As corn is a better heat-producing feed than the other grains, more corn should be fed during cold weather than on warm winter days.

Try mashes should be kept before the flocks at all times, so that they can have access to them whenever hungry. This saves time and labor. The hens do not have to grind the mash in their gizzards, so it can be eaten at any time the chickens feel inclined to do so.

It is estimated that hens which are kept confined eat from 70 to 100 pounds of grain and mash in a year. Light breeds such as Leghorns and like breeds will eat the smaller amount. This means that each hen will eat 3 to 4 ounces a day. A quart of dry mash mentioned above will weigh approximately one pound. A quart of scratch feed will weigh approximately 1 1/2 pounds. Therefore, one quart of such a dry mash and one quart of such a scratch feed would be enough to feed 10 hens of the larger breeds one day. Plymouth Rocks, Wyandottes, Rhode Island Reds, and other breeds are considered the larger general purpose breeds. If you have a more or less number of hens you can figure from these amounts how much you should feed each day.

Late Molting Hens Are Best for Breeding Pen

There are many hens that lay all summer, but those that lay in the fall are the best for breeding. They are more fertile and their eggs are larger. They are also more resistant to disease and they are more likely to raise their chicks. Late molting hens are usually the best producers.

Shed-Roof House

Ten feet is about the right depth for a shed-roof house, with the front wall six feet high and the rear one four feet. Face the front wall south or southwest to get the direct sunlight, and leave it open part way down. Then have shutters covered with burlap or canvas to cover the openings in stormy or rainy weather. In sections having severe winters, there should also be curtains to drop around the doors on cold nights.

Young chickens make better breeders than do young geese.

Already the poultry breeder is dreaming of the chicks which he will hatch next March and April and the wise breeder will give some thought to the hens and pullets from which he will breed next spring.

Green feeds are of great value to flocks and should be supplied to the flock through the winter months.

Arrange your market, if you have not already done so. Poultrymen who accept any old market they can get seldom make the highest profits that they are entitled to.

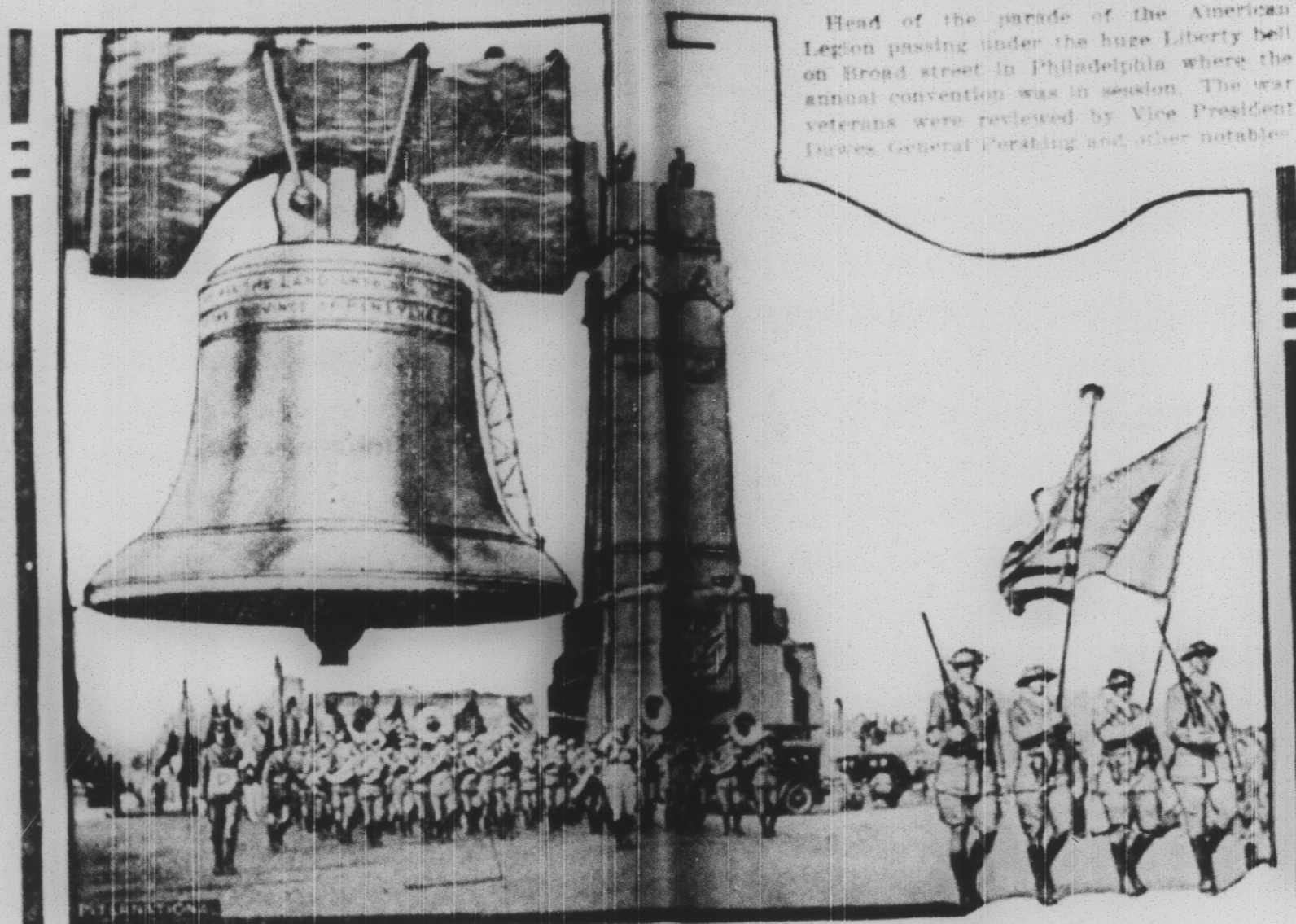
Most of the vegetables that can be stored through the winter make satisfactory green feed for poultry. They include cabbage, beets, carrots, potatoes and mangels.

It is hard to find more profitable birds to keep on the farm than a flock of turkeys.

Poultrymen advise keeping the selected young roosters by themselves in preparation for the breeding season.

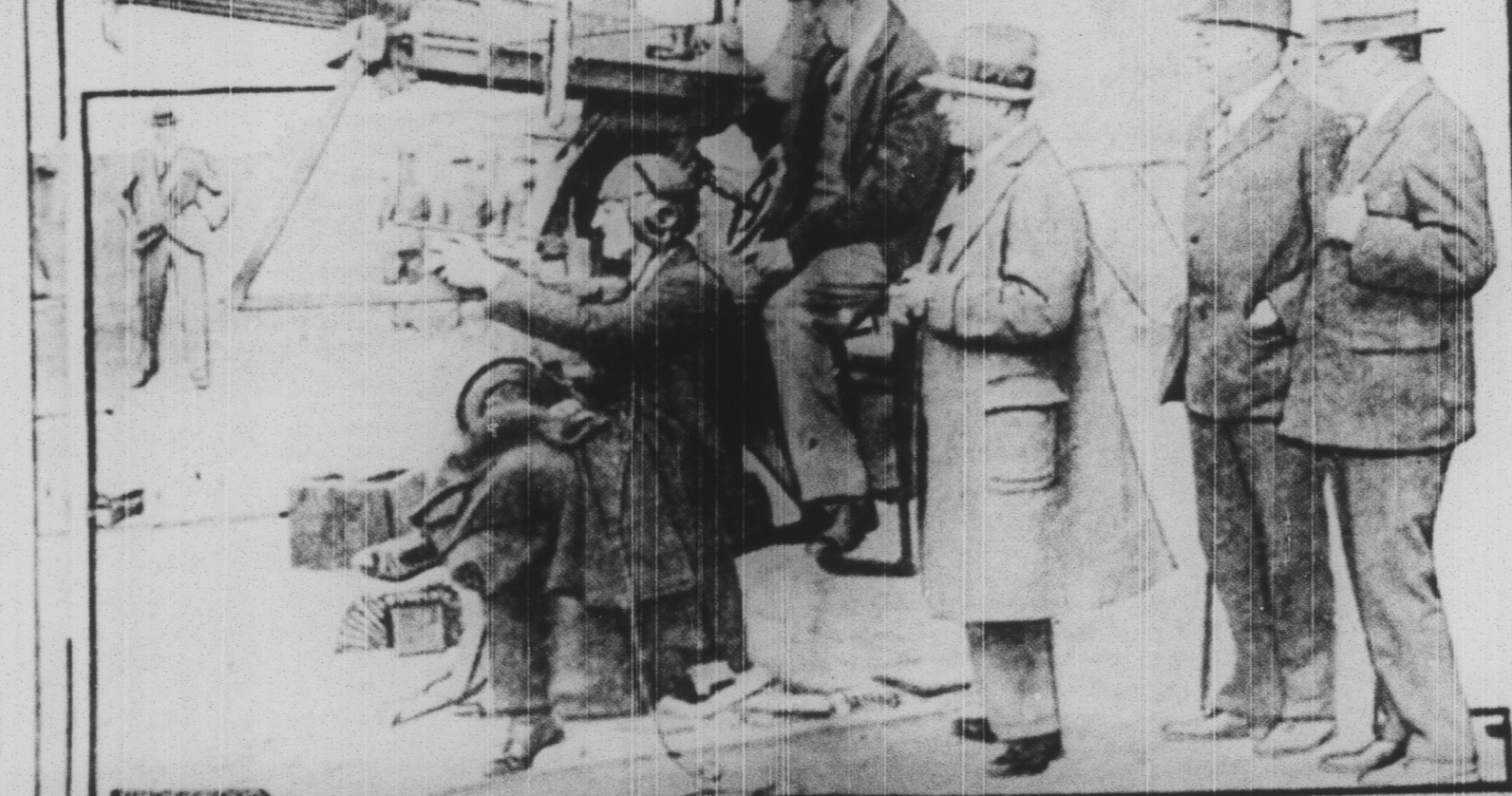
Much equipment is not essential to raise turkeys successfully, but some valuable work is required in their care, especially while they are very young, care and cleanliness being two important factors.

Parade of the American Legion in Philadelphia



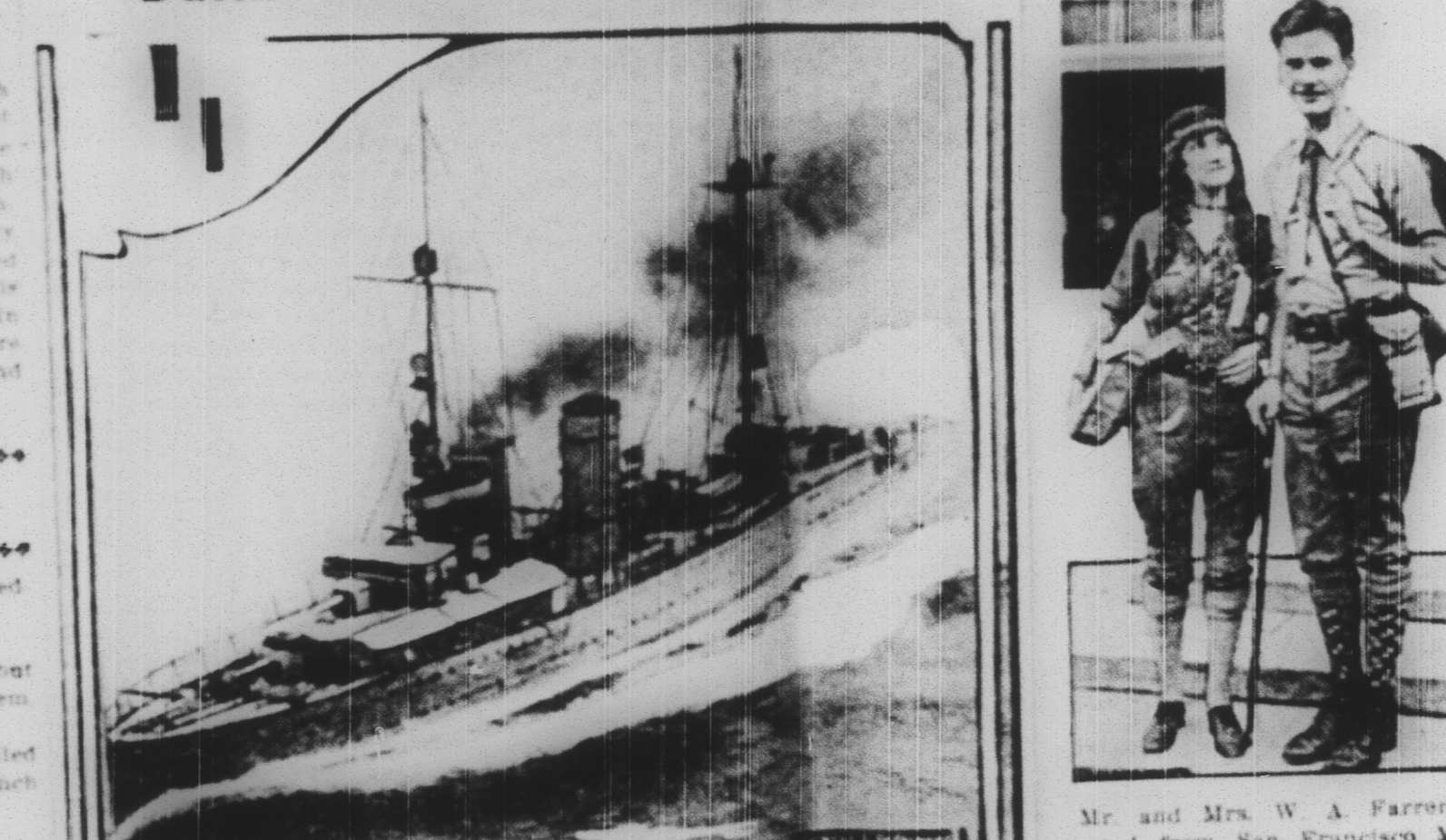

PURSUES ENEMY 2,000 MILES TO TAKE HIS LIFE

Accountant Trails Soldier of Fortune Who Defrauded Him Three Years.

Portland, Maine—A 3,000-mile journey to slay the man who abandoned him in a Mexican jail ended successfully for Benjamin H. Turner, mild-mannered little American accountant from Mexico City.

Tried in Mexico for murder, Turner said he was released three years ago and since had trailed James D. Hallen, soldier of fortune with international record for larceny, forgery and swindling operations, to "settle with him" for taking his life savings and then failing to defend him at his trial.

Wants to Be Arrested.

Turner accomplished his purpose at Hallen's home in Palmyra, Pa. Calling Hallen from the home, Turner pumped three bullets into his body, then told two terrified witnesses to "get the police, I won't run."

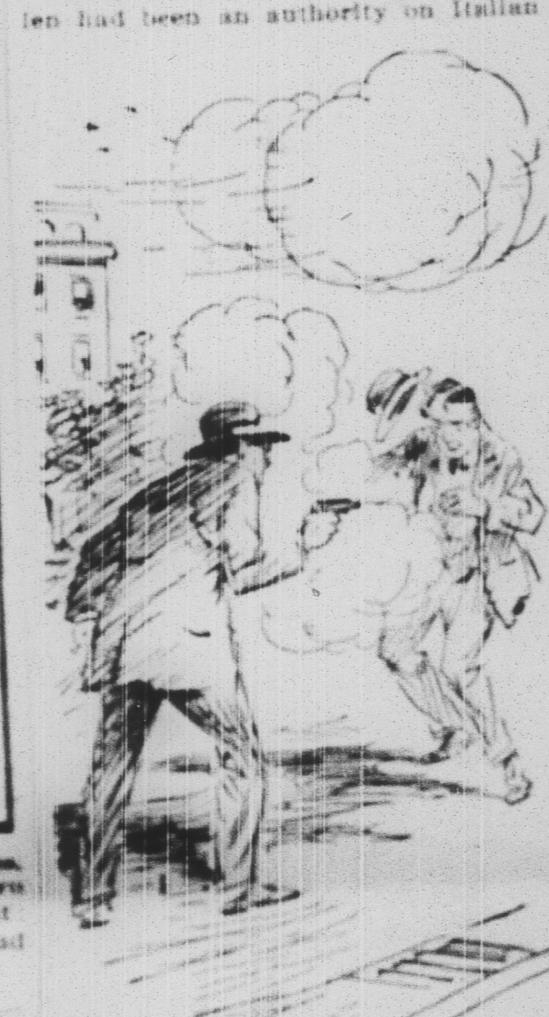
Turner's story and newspaper clippings found in his trunk at a hotel disclosed that in 1921 he shot and killed Ramon Arguelles, Mexico City broker, for swindling him. Letters to detective agencies indicated that he turned over all his money, \$3,200, to Hallen as attorney's fees and that Hallen left for the United States soon afterward. Turner was acquitted in March, 1923, after members of the American colony had hired counsel for him.

Lawyer and Art Authority.

The police were informed that Hallen had been an authority on Italian art and literature, a lecturer on drama, a keen keeper, a promoter of stock schemes, a theater owner and had dipped into journalism in the Hawaiian Islands and San Francisco.

His wife witnessed the shooting and fainted when one of the bullets ripped into the room in which she was sitting.

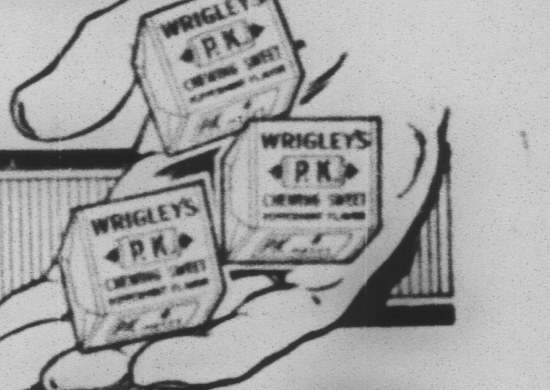
Big Tobacco Revenue

Clerk Routs Bandits With Loaf of Bread

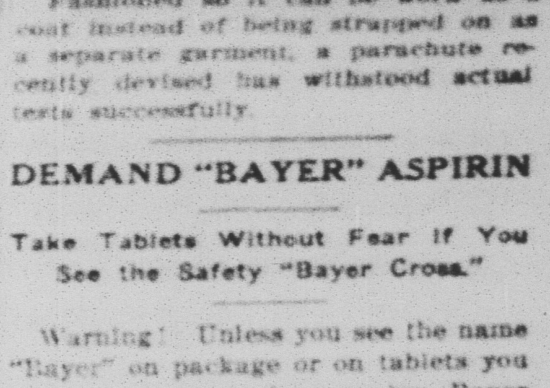

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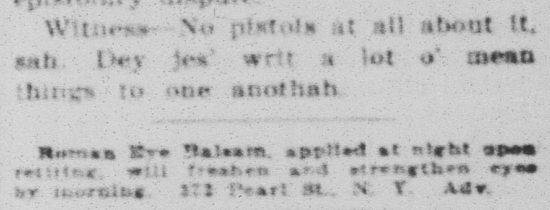
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HEADS THE BANKERS
