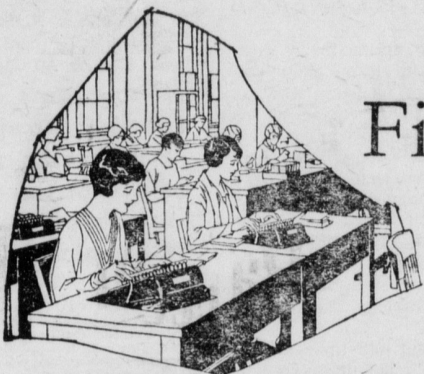

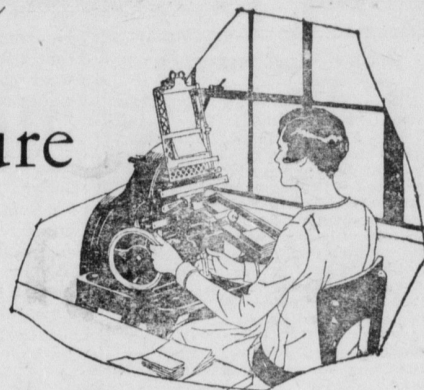

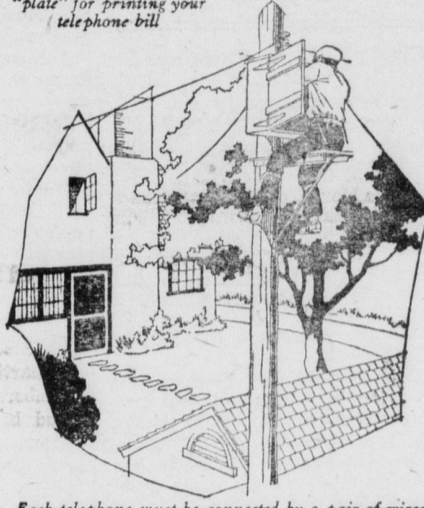

STANDARDS OF LIVING VERY MUCH IMPROVED

"The standards of living have been very much improved within the last 20 years," said Dr. Theodore B. Appel, Secretary of health, this week. "Many of the common-place features now connected with our existence were either unknown two decades ago or were enjoyed alone by those having wealth. This marked progress has undoubtedly developed an increased joy in living."

"Many advances during this same period have also been made in the science of living. In this achievement preventative medicine has played an active part. For example, medical inspection of school children was begun in 1894. In the same year diphtheria antitoxin was first distributed by a city. The first tuberculosis clinic was organized in that year also, as was the first state health laboratory. Proof that mosquitoes carried yellow fever was made in 1900. The Pure Food and Drug Act was passed in 1906. The first open air school was founded in 1908. The public drinking cup was abolished first in 1909; and in the same year anti-typhoid inoculation was begun in the United States Army. Rural nursing service was started in 1912 and the Slick test was first used in 1914. Health education in the schools began in 1918. Toxin-antitoxin was first administered in 1918 also. And antitoxin for scarlet fever became scientifically established in 1923.

"A review of these significant facts indicates the reason for much of the conservation of human life within a comparatively few years. Official efforts to protect human life will be unremittingly continued. Large sums of money will be spent with that object in view.

"However, most of the things which the individual, as such, is called upon to do in order to develop a healthy body and maintain it, costs him practically nothing in dollars and cents.

"Possibly that is one of the main reasons why more attention is not given to matters of this character. For example there is no fee attached to eating the kind of food which your body requires and disregarding that which is not best for you. A two-mile walk each day will expend energy on your part but will involve no money outlay. Cultivating a cheerful disposition is not marked with a high price tag either. And eight hours sleep each night will not be any more expensive than five or six.

"It is a human failing to place value upon that for which we have to spend money. Quackery, health fads and high priced patent medicines demand coin. But, generally speaking, good health and good health practices are not counter propositions. They demand personal interest and application—nothing more. Consider this the next time you feel inclined to indulge in high priced luxuries for your health's sake.

"Supreme and satisfying good health should be every one's goal. It is not yours to purchase. The most luxurious of the luxuries, namely health, is yours for the taking. Therefore, don't try to buy it. Fresh air, sunshine, pure water, exercise and the rest are free. Take them, in spite of that fact."
