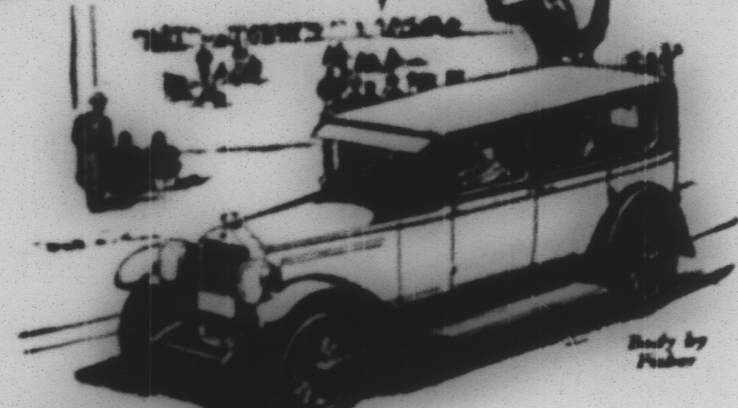

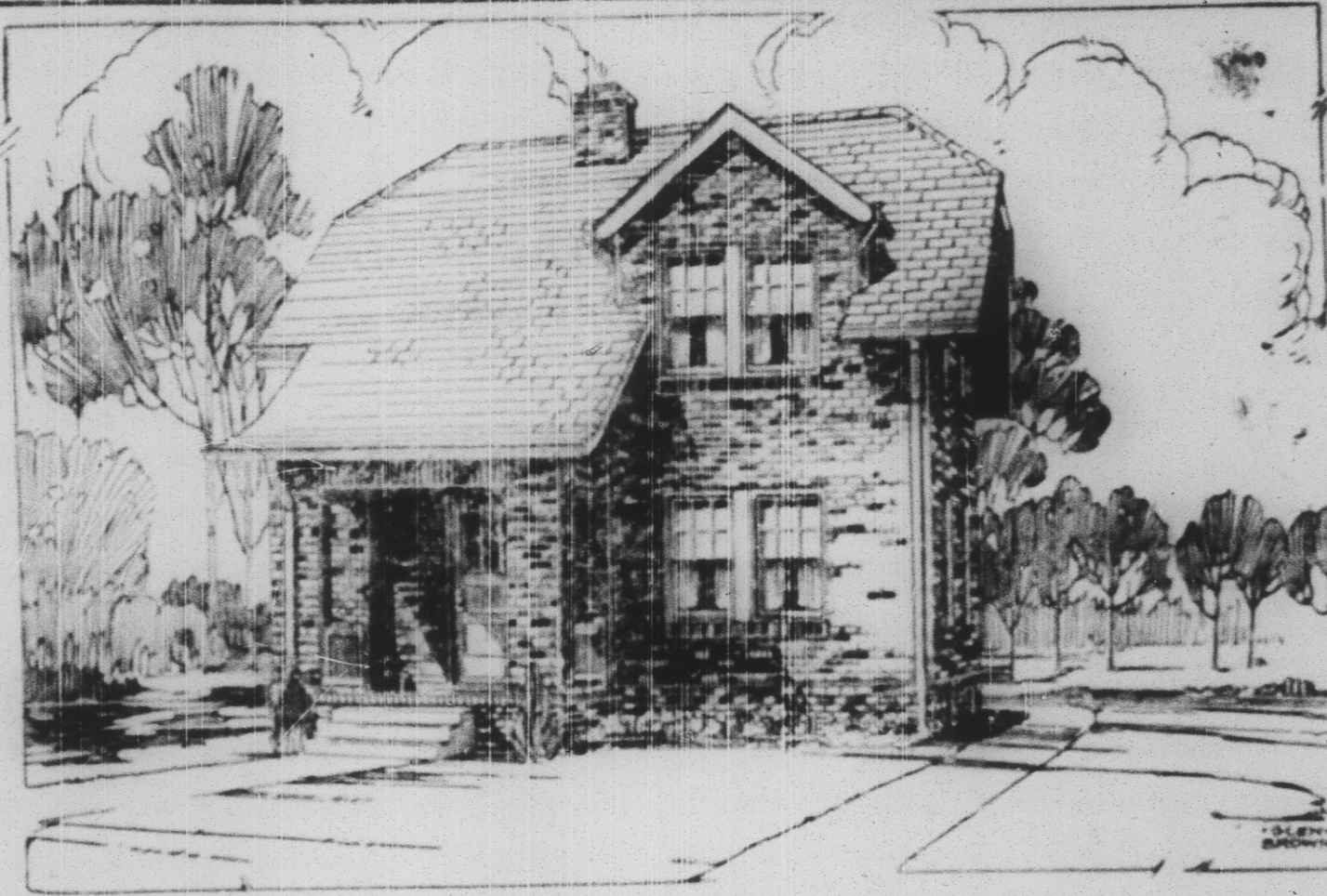

THE SAGUAH—DESIGN A305

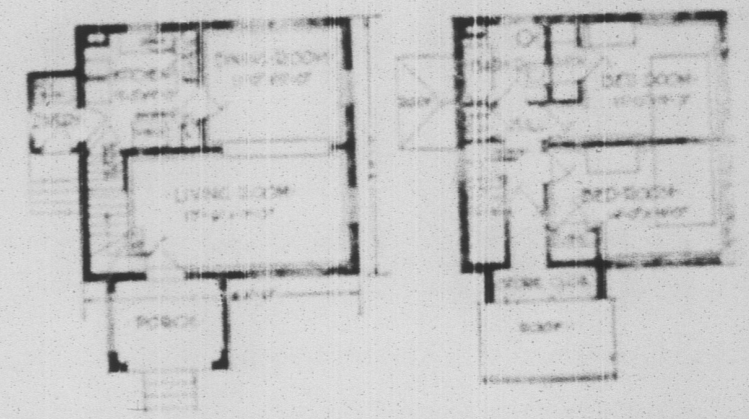

At Omaha, Babe Ruth, mentioned, as token of his greatness, an egg laid by Lady Norkfolk, champion hen of the world.

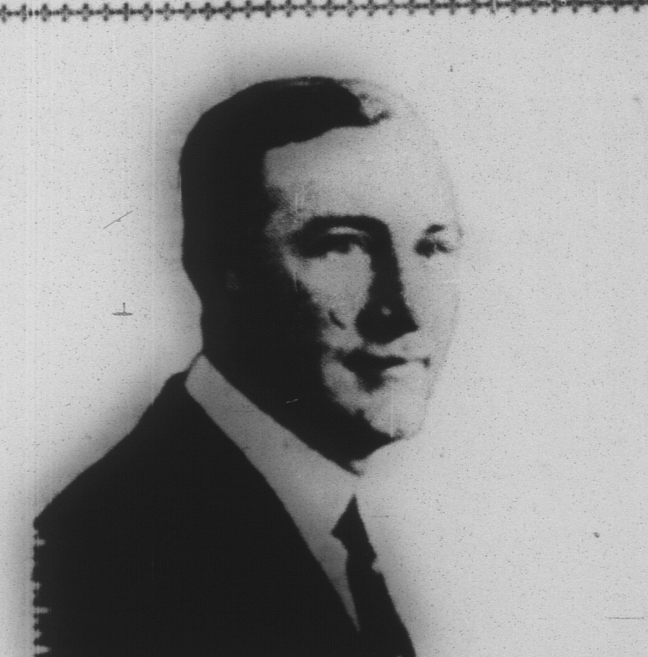

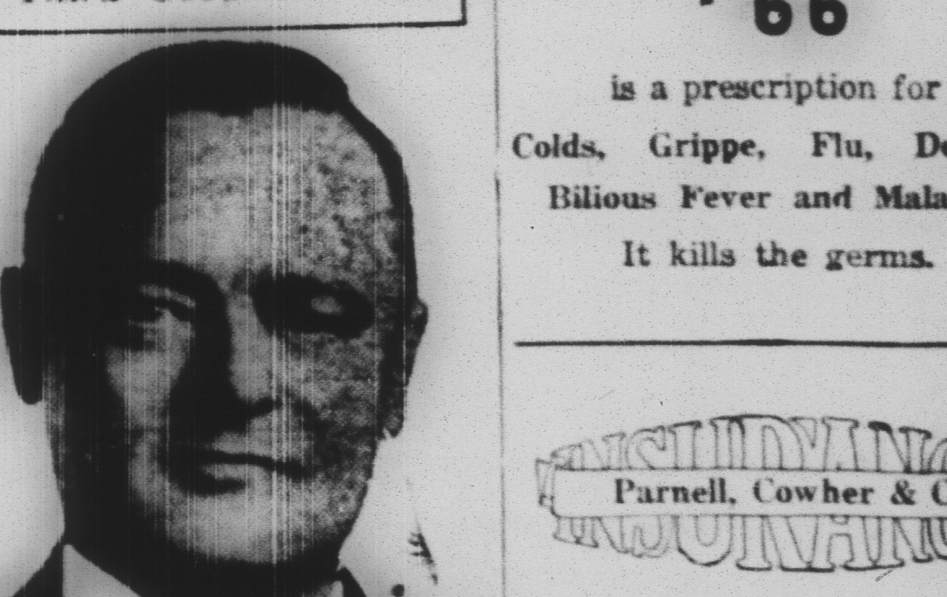

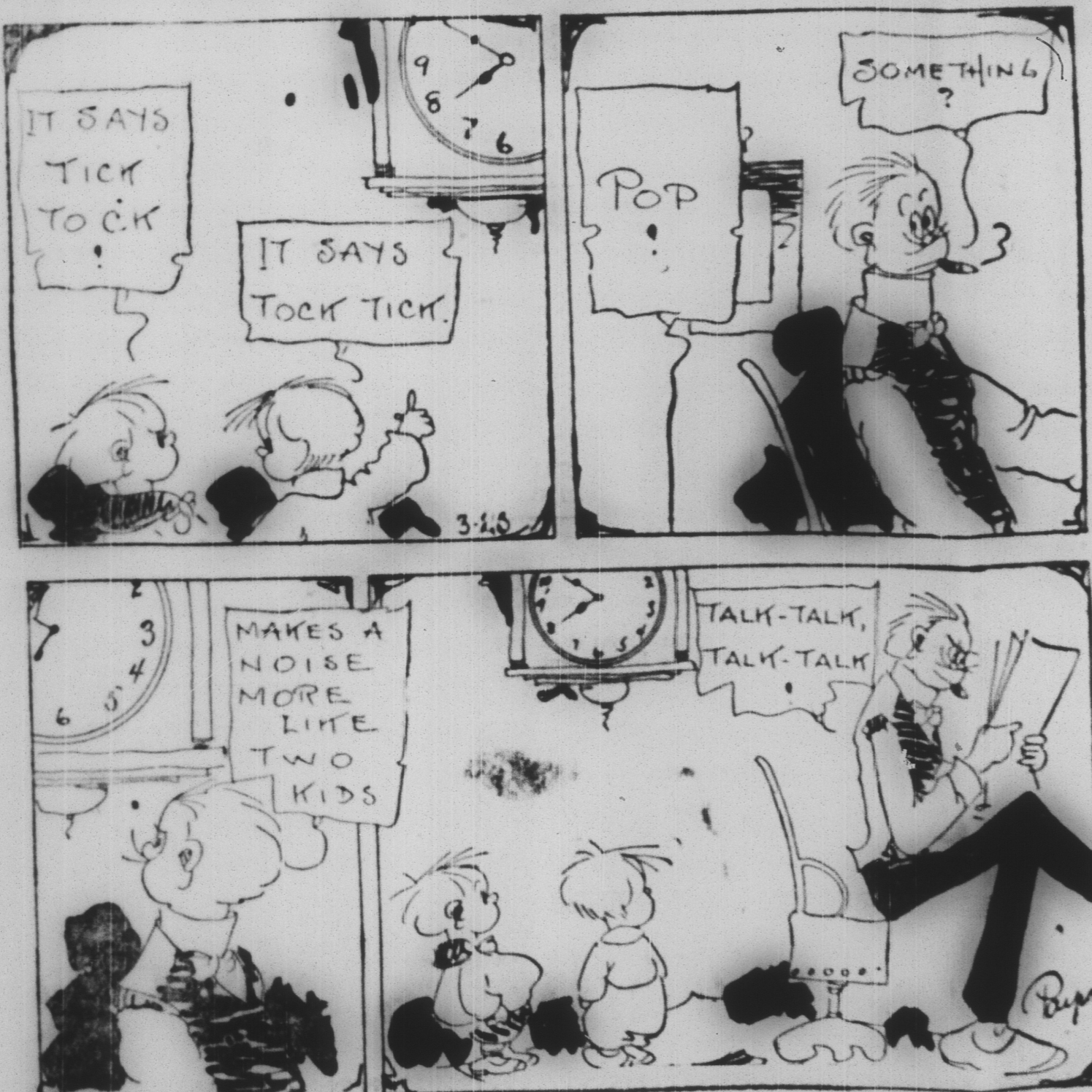
