Little Need to Work Fiji islanders have a pretty easy time, little work and no rent to pay. The placid life of the islanders brightens the heavy reading of the annual colonial report for 1927, which has just been issued by the British

"Labor conditions do not exercise any considerable influence on the Fijians as a whole," declares the report, "apart from affording additional social amenities. Every Fijian is a member of a land-owning unit and has the right to use a portion of the tribal lands for planting crops for food and profit, or for raising cattle.

"If he remains in his village, he is provided with a house of native construction, built by the community of which he is a member. Beyond per-forming his share of the work done for its own benefit by the community as a whole, he pays no rent either for his land or his house."
