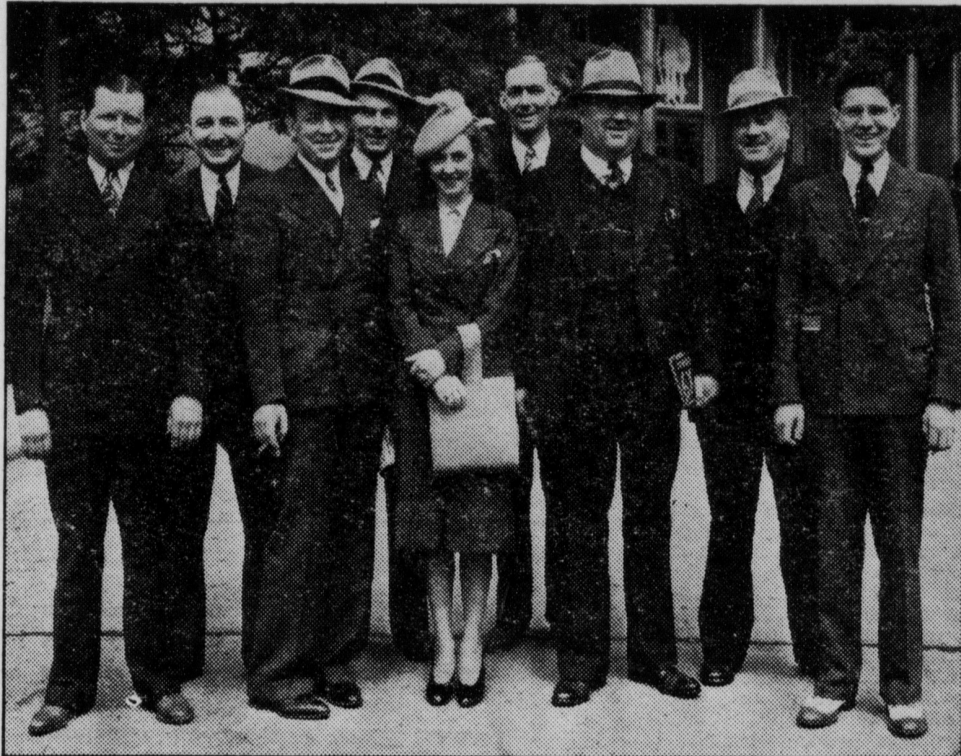


**HARRY STOLTZ CAUGHT IN GROUP PHOTOGRAPH OF DEALERS AT DEARBORN, MICH.**

**LAW TO DISARM PLANTS FOR OPPRESSIVE LABOR TACTICS, SOUGHT**

Washington — Senator Robert M. LaFollette (P.-Wis.) last Thursday pleaded for legislation to "disarm" employers and remove what he described

as oppressive labor tactics. "There are still factories which stand like fortresses, bristling with machine guns and modern chemical weapons," LaFollette told a sub-committee of the Senate labor and education committee of which he is a member. He continued: "There are still private armies which are drilled and trained by certain corporations for active combat during industrial disputes. There are still large industrial centers, like urban Harlan ('Bloody Harlan' County, Kentucky), where the constitutional rights of citizens are trampled down by selfish, powerful interests."

The LaFollette bill, based upon recommendations of the Senate Civil Liberties committee, which has held extensive public hearings on the alleged violations of citizens' rights, would prohibit use of labor spies and labor espionage; use of strikebreakers and strikebreaking agencies, use of privately-paid armed guards off the premises of an employer and possession and utilization of industrial munitions such as tear gas and sub-machine guns. LaFollette said the bill would not prevent an employer from employing watchmen to guard property, or in time of strike, prevent an employer from securing bona fide workmen to operate his plants on a permanent basis.
