SOME FACTS ABOUT HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE

Fifteen per cent of all adults are said to have especially high blood pressure.

One-fourth of all patients who are more than 53 years of age die of hypertension.

This symptom springs from one of the most common but complex conditions encountered in medical practice.

There have been a great variety of drugs, diets and regimens used in treating high blood pressure.

But cases of hypertension, or high blood pressure, vary so much with each individual that each case is a distinct problem.

Just what causes high blood pressure is not known.

It may be caused by nervous tension.

Perhaps it is due to excessive secretion of one of the endocrine glands.

High blood pressure may be caused by any one of these.

High blood pressure in many cases through a so-called functional stage in which there is no evidence of disease of the blood vessels.

As the disease progresses, however, there is a change, first in more minute vessels, followed by dangerous complications.

In the early stages of high blood pressure there may be symptoms, so the patient consults the doctor only when the disease is well developed.

If treatment is to be entirely successful it should begin as early as is possible.

The only satisfactory way this disease can be detected is by periodic health examinations.

Because it is believed there is definite hereditary factor in high blood pressure, those whose family history record this symptom complex should be examined frequently.

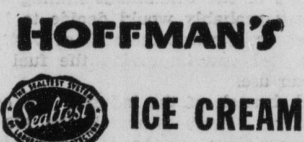

Mr. Williams has been a resident over 20 years of Westmont, for which he served as burgess for 12 years and did not ask reelection. He has had years of professional and business experience and should be well qualified to fill the office to which he aspires. While burgess he was very active in retaining the Incline Plane when it was to be abandoned by the steel company. He has always taken an active interest in sports of all kinds and is very popular with the young people. He organized the community baseball league, furnishing the equipment to start. He served one term in the general assembly and in 1931 introduced a bill to eliminate one of the common pleas judges, a bill which at that time was very unpopular, but which of recent years is a plank in the platform of every candidate running for the general assembly. For three years Mr. Williams worked in the county division of the auditor general's department. The work brought him in direct contact with all county offices, as well as local offices, such as mayors, aldermen, burgesses and justices of the peace. He covered a majority of counties of the state. He taught mathematics in the public schools for seven years and graduated from the Pennsylvania Business College, Lancaster. Williams worked in the mines and woods to pay for his education. He has never before asked for or held any county office.
