**EMPLOYMENT IN WPA INCREASED**

Harrisburg — WPA employment in Pennsylvania has increased for the ninth consecutive week, state headquarters announced last Thursday.

Approximately 1,564 project workers were added bringing the state total to 146,983, the report showed. Principal increases were in Reading, 671, and the Pittsburgh areas, 430.

"The upward trend of private employment continued to affect project employment," the report stated. "To effect the increase of 1,564 persons, the WPA employment division made 6,391 assignments from the commonwealth's assistance rolls by that number of persons.

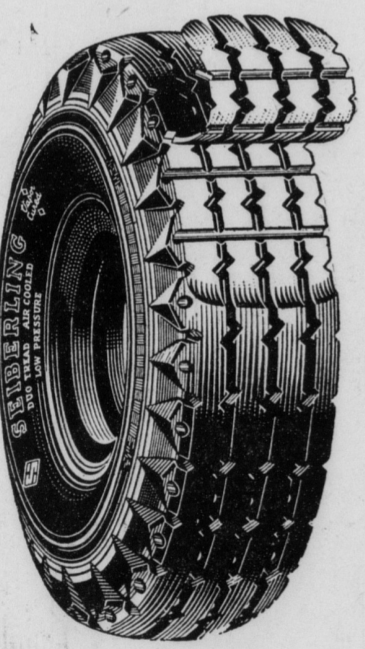
