Reckless Driving Charged in Fatal County Mishap A coroner's jury last week found that Donald Lewis Shaw of Hubbard, O., was operating his automobile in a reckless manner when the car struck and fatally injured John Soveskie, 41, of Revloc. The jury's verdict recommended that a further investigation of the fatality be made by the district attorney's office. Inquest proceedings were held at the courthouse in Ebsenburg by Coroner Patrick McDermott. Soveskie was run over on the night of July 25, while he was walking along Route 421 at the intersection of the highway between Stopville and Revloc. He died July 29 in Memorial Hospital, Johnstown, as a result of internal injuries, a fracture of the left leg and abrasions of the head. Members of the jury were Attorney Tillman Saylor, Joseph Faganella, Francis Terrasi, Fred Busby and Patrick Kelly.
