COMPUTING OVER-TIME RATES Salaried employees, whether they are paid by the week or month, are entitled to over-time compensation under the Fair Labor Standards Act.
When the salaried employee has a egular workweek set by agreement or custom, the hourly rate remains unchanged, even in weeks where over

Example: Henry receives \$80 per month and his regular workweek is 40 hours set by agreement or custom. His weekly earnings are found by translating the monthly salary to an annual salary (80 x 12 equals \$960) and dividing by 52 (\$960 divided by 52 equals \$18.46). Therefore, his weekly salary is \$18.46 and his hourly rate 46 cents (\$8.60 divided by 40). If he works 50 hours in any week, he should be paid \$25.30 or \$6.90 addi-


