**ARMY WILL CANCEL MANY HOTEL LEASES**

**LAUD IMPROVEMENTS IN HASTINGS MINES**

The Federal Bureau of Mines has lauded recent improvements in ventilating and blasting practice in the Nos. 1 and 2 mines of the Hastings Fuel Company. In an inspection report, however, additional safeguards were recommended. Company records show that the mines employ 109 men and produced 450 tons of coal daily.

The accident frequency increased during the past year. The two mines are rated non-gassy by the state department of mines and only a trace of methane was found in air samples. It was suggested that open flame cap lamps be replaced with permissible electrical cap lamps. The report also recommends providing and enforcing rules for systematic timbering to protect miners from falls of rock and coal. The fed-

eral inspector also lauded the good maintenance of electrical equipment, the guarding of moving machinery parts, the use of drags on the rear of trips and the maintenance of haulage equipmnet.
