

NOTICE OF NOVEMBER ELECTION

WHEREAS, BY AN ACT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, ENTITLED "AN ACT CONCERNING ELECTIONS INCLUDING GENERAL, MUNICIPAL, SPECIAL AND PRIMARY ELECTIONS, ETC.," APPROVED THE 3RD DAY OF JUNE, 1937, IT IS ENJOINED UPON US TO GIVE PUBLIC NOTICE OF SAID ELECTION AND TO ENUMERATE WHAT OFFICERS ARE TO BE ELECTED, AS WELL AS THE PLACES AT WHICH SAID ELECTION IS TO BE HELD. WE DO HEREBY MAKE KNOWN AND GIVE NOTICE TO THE ELECTORS OF CAMBRIA COUNTY THAT A MUNICIPAL ELECTION WILL BE HELD IN THE COUNTY FORESAID

ON THE SECOND DAY OF NOVEMBER, A. D. 1943

THE SAME BEING THE TUESDAY NEXT FOLLOWING THE FIRST MONDAY OF SAID MONTH, AT WHICH TIME STATE, COUNTY, CITYWIDE, WARD, BOROUGH, TOWNSHIP, SCHOOL DISTRICT AND ELECTION OFFICERS WILL BE ELECTED.

A cross mark (X) in the square opposite the name of a candidate indicates a vote for that candidate. To vote a straight party ticket mark a cross (X) in the square in the Party Column opposite the name of the party of your choice. To vote for an individual candidate of another party, after making a mark in the party square, mark a cross (X) opposite his or her name. For an office where more than one candidate is to be voted for, the voter, after marking in the party square, may divide his or her vote by marking a cross (X) to the right of each candidate for whom he or she desires to vote. For such office votes shall not be counted for candidates not individually marked. To vote for a person whose name is not on the ballot, write or paste his or her name in the blank space provided for that purpose. This shall count as a vote without the cross mark. If you make a mistake, do not erase, ask for a new ballot. Use only pencil or indelible pencil.
