





BAGWORM PEST MOLLE PREVALENT IN STATE What appears to be an increased number of bagworm saces on orna-mental trees in various parts of the state is reported by inspectors of the Bureau of Plant Industry in the Pennsylvania Department of Agri-culture. This insect pest seems to prefer such evergreens as spruce, juniper and ar-borvitate, and such decidious trees as maples, black locust and fruit trees, according to Dr. T. J. L. Guy-ton, director of the bureau. The bag-like shelter that it builds in which to live. These bags are the ov-er-wintering stage and are easy to recognize. They are grayish dark, about one and one-half to two inches long, tapered at each end. These bags are suspended from the smaller twigs of the infested tree. Inside of some are 200 or 300 eggs which will hatch in late spring. The worms that appear then will feed on the foliage of the tree on which they spent the wild ide, Dr. Guyton explains. Where only one or two rather small trees are infested, a good method of con-trol is to remove and burn the over-wintering form, making certain that all bags are collected. 
