Mrs. Catherine Norton, Dolores Kline and Mary Ellen Norton were visitors in Johnstown Saturday.

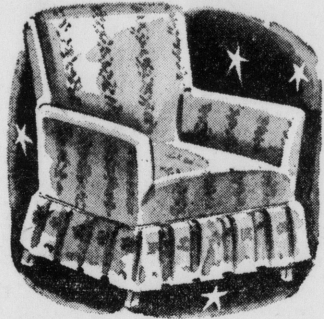

STRAW FOR REMEMBRANCE.

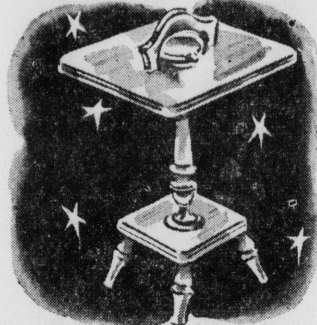
