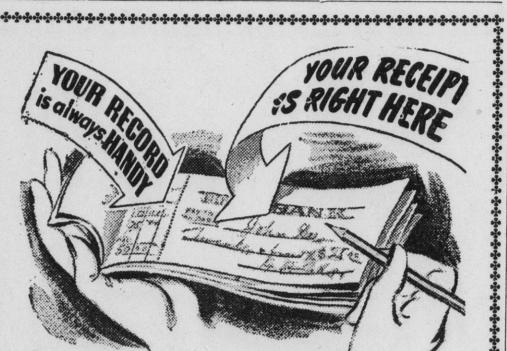

PLANS FOR IMPROVING CRESSON INSTITUTION

Improvements totaling \$964,084 at Mt. Alto and Cresson tuberculosis sanatoriums were approved late last week by Gov. Edward Martin as one of the commonwealth's first post-war construction projects.

The improvements include \$238,250 at Mt. Alto, and \$725,834 at the Cresson institution, and mark the state's initial step toward providing greater accommodations for tubercular patients and to take care of a large waiting list which developed during the war.

The State Health Department announced previously that a long waiting list developed because of the help shortage. Bed space currently is available to accommodate at least 300 more patients if sufficient doctors and nurses were available. This handicap was expected to be overcome now that the war has ended.

The improvements at Mt. Alto will include a ground lighting system, new laundry equipment and an additional water supply.

Cresson expenditures will enable the building of a nurses home, construction of quarters for male and female employees, improvement of sewage treatment plants, construction of a new automatic refrigeration plant, construction of five cottages for married couples, including physicians, new floor for the main kitchen and rebuilding of the sanatorium piggery.

Funds for the improvements were provided by the 1945 Legislature, which appropriated \$10,325,000 to the department for the construction of buildings and other public works. None of the department's other projects have as yet been approved.
