Highway Department to Clear 20,200 Miles of Road This Year

The Pennsylvania State Highway Department is now ready to start the "most efficient" snow-removal project in the history of the commonwealth.

It has been announced by John U. Shroyer, secretary, that the department will be responsible for the clearing of 20,200 miles of primary and secondary roads as well as non-programmed highways.

A three-foot clearance on each side of the pavement and opening of drains and ditches after storms will be among the requirements of crews this winter.

PLANS BEING MADE BY SPORTSMEN FOR SPRING DOG SHOW

Funds Would Be Used for Fish Propagating Ponds Within Limits of the County

Plans for a mammoth county-wide dog show at the Ebensburg Fairgrounds next spring were outlined during a meeting of the Cambria County Sportsmen's Association last Wednesday night in the Ebensburg Courthouse.

The show would be held in conjunction with the Johnstown Kennel Club. Plans are still being discussed with members of the Johnstown organization for co-sponsorship of the American Kennel Club show, and arrangements will be worked out with the officers of the local and national organizations.

All funds gained by the affair would be used for promoting the current sportsmen's campaign for the establishment of fish propagating ponds in this district.

At the same meeting the county organization adopted a resolution opposing an open season on antlerless deer in 1946.

A majority of the associated organizations handed in petitions advocating the construction of a 200-acre recreational dam in Jenner Twp., near Jennerstown, Pa. These will be forwarded to the State Department of Forests and Waters.

Another campaign was launched at the meeting for the trapping of rabbits during the winter months in areas where hunting is restricted and liberate them in places in which hunting is permitted. Boy Scouts will be asked to assist in this year's program, as they did during 1945.

Sportsmen reported that the hunting season now in progress is the worst one in recent years due to the Pennsylvania Game Commission not stocking enough small game this season.

Two new clubs—Spangler Dog Training Club and Mundy's Corner Hunting & Fishing Club—were admitted to membership in the association during the meeting.

Donations to the fish propagating fund were given by the Revloc Outdoor Club and West Taylor Sportsmen's Club.

Plans are also being laid for a fox hunt this winter to rid the vermin from the county.

BLANDBURG PLANS MEMORIAL STATUE

In memory of the men of St. Richard's mission Catholic parish in Blandburg, parishioners of the church have proposed the erection of a monument on the church lawn.

The proposed monument is to consist of a statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, with His hand raised in blessing, surmounted upon a base of handcut stone.

The statue will be of white stone with the names of Sylvester Duke, Stephen Benek, John Misocco and Robert Reese inscribed upon the bronze plate to be attached to the base.

Work has already been started on the foundation, which is expected to be completed by Christmas. The statue will be obtained next spring. Work is being supervised by the pastor, Rev. Father Michael E. Smith, and he is being assisted by a dozen men of the community.

Ceiling Prices Rise on Men's Shirts, Underwear and Socks

The OPA has announced that it is authorizing ceiling price raises for certain lower-priced clothing articles in an effort to stimulate production.

The order is now in effect and means higher prices to consumers for lower quality men's shirts, men's women's and children's underwear and nightwear, cotton hosiery, boys' woven dress shirts, men's handkerchiefs, infant's knit vests and children's and infant's anklets.

SUSQUEHANNA TWP. COAL LAND BID UPON

An offer of Andrew B. Crichton, Johnstown coal operator, of \$400 for 347 parcels of mineral rights in Susquehanna Twp., which was acquired by Cambria County at a treasurer's sale, will be heard by county courts next Monday.

Court records show the land was previously owned by the Marion Center Coal Co., and taken over by the Indiana Deposit Bank. Taxes and penalties against the property are \$2,199.21.
