A large representation of mem-

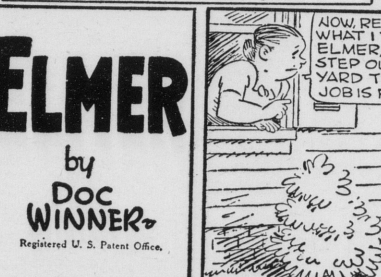
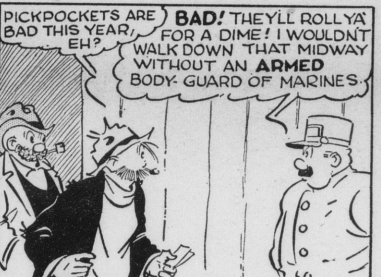
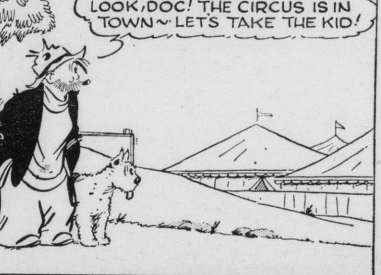
