Both young men were unable to attend when their Eagle awards were originally made.

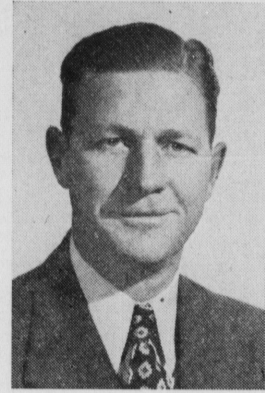
10,621 UNEMPLOYED

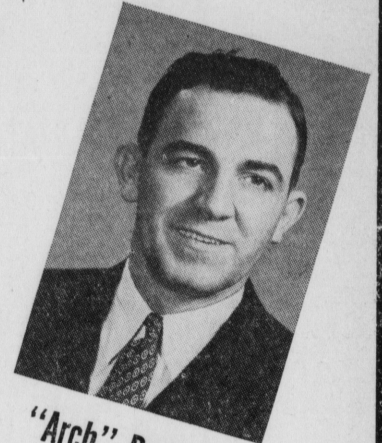

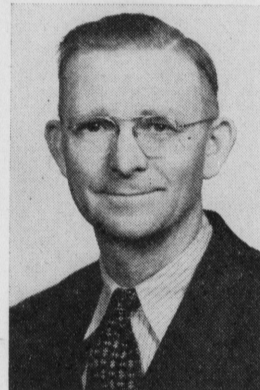
