DEAN TWP. CLOSES RICHLAND SCHOOL

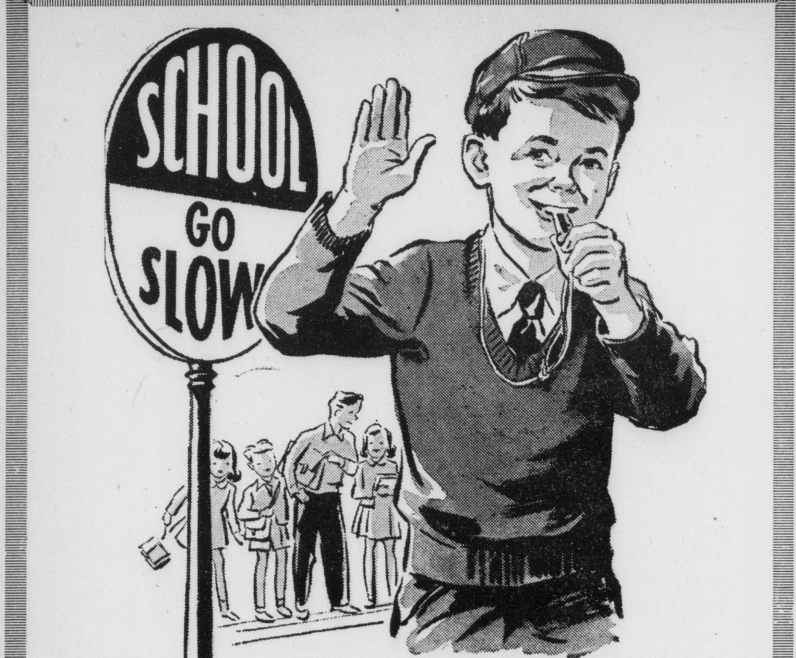

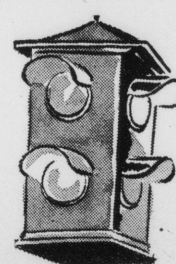
