BRANDIS GLACIERS TURN BACK PORTAGE

The Brandis Glaciers of Barnesboro won their third game on Monday last by taking the Portage Bulldogs, 52-28, at Barnesboro Firemen's Hall before a jammed house. The Glaciers led the first quarter, 10-7, but trailed at half, 19-7. They regained the lead in the third stanza, holding it to the finish. Jot Roman of the Glaciers (center) was high scorer with 11, followed by Kupetz, also of the Glaciers, with 10.

BUDDY KERR LEADING SHORTSTOP IN MAJORS

Buddy Kerr of the N. Y. Giants was the best defensive shortstop in major baseball leagues for the 1946 season with a fielding average of .982. Kerr set a new record by playing the last 52 games of the season without an error, thus breaking Leo Durocher's Cincinnati record of 51 games in 1931.


