Tyrone Wins 3rd Title by Defeating DuBois Hi Friday

Tyrone High, with 15 consecutive wins over a two-year period, closed its 1947 season last Friday evening by defeating DuBois High by a score of 19-7.

This victory enabled the Tyrone eleven to cop its third title of the year—the Western Conference.

They also hold the Central Co. Conference and Bald Eagle Conference titles.

Tyrone has been undefeated since early in the 1946 season, winning 11 games this year—10 of them being in the Western Conference.

DuBois, which had an opportunity to win the Western Conference this year by upsetting Tyrone, scored its lone touchdown in the final period on a 93-yard drive.

DuBois game had a 6-1 Western Conference record.

Tyrone took a lead in the first period on a 77-yard touchdown drive, and in the second period a pass was good for another goal.

A 53-yard drive added the final six-pointer.

The purchase price hasn't been released, but estimates are that it is around \$80,000.

Still Talk About Gionfriddo's Catch

Ever since Al Gionfriddo of Dyar, Brooklyn Dodger outfielder, won undying fame with the catch he made of Joe DiMaggio in the 6th game of the 1947 World's Series, fans have been arguing whether or not he robbed the Yankee Clipper of a home run or merely an extra base hit of less damage.

Everyone agrees that the catch saved the ball game, and that it was the greatest catch in World's Series play since Harry Hooper's in 1912, if not indeed the greatest in history.

To settle the other argument, Bobby Bragan, the Dodger manager, seems the best witness. He was in the bullpen right back of Gionfriddo at the time.

"It would have been a home run into the bullpen by a good two feet," said Bragan.

Billy Fox Takes LaMotta in 4th

Billy Fox of Philadelphia, who is gunning for another chance at the light-heavyweight championship, last Friday handed tough Mike LaMotta of the Bronx the first knockout of his career in a fourth round win, after Referee Frank Fullam stopped what had become a slaughter.

LaMotta, who never has been knocked down in the ring, never had a chance. Fox didn't get LaMotta down Friday either, but it goes on the books as a technical knockout—Billy's 50th in his 51 professional bouts. Fox was KO'd once himself—by Gus Lesnevich, the light-heavyweight king.
