ness Corporation Law of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, approved May 5, 1933, said corporation to be named "McCormick-Snyder Coal Company."

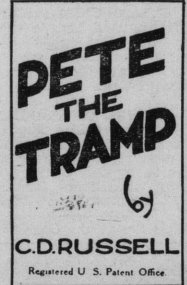
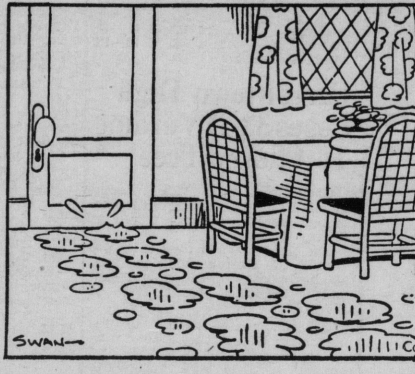

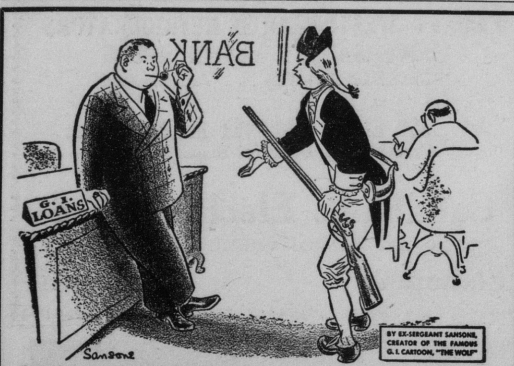
