

Spring Suits Are Younger; Shorter Jacket, Longer Skirt

Small Waist Continues In New Fashion Trend
If skirts have gone down and out, jackets have gone up until they are very, very short, says Marian Corey, who writes about this and other fashion trends in a recent issue of McCall's:

"The youngest thing in spring suits is the one with the wide waist skirt and the short short jacket. One such suit has a short jacket with a jouncy hipline. It should adorn only the smallest of waists. The drop shoulders are padded roundly, not squarely, and not thickly either. The skirt has a three-yard whirl at the hemline. "The short jacket is of first importance to the very youthful suit for spring. And when a jacket is very short, the skirt is very wide. The flared skirt of one suit zooms out to more than three yards at the hem and that, incidentally, is the best of the new wide widths, having a nice whirl but not being outrageously bulky. The jacket has a little flit of flare at the hips, just to make things interesting at the rear.

"Another suit has just about everything a girl could wish for in a suit: a new neckline—the shawl collar, a new kind of fit in the jacket—12 narrow panels, a tiny waistline, a bustle ripple and a back flare in the skirt. A sophisticated, elegant suit number is just the thing for gabardine or faille or satin. The backward dip of the jacket is important—it's in the waist and in the peplum both. The skirt is slim, as it should be with such a jacket.

"The low flare is a new fashion combining with long slim lines to make a new silhouette. In a dress that illustrates this, there are actually two flounces—one for ripple, and an under one, in taffeta for rustle. A tunic is a nice way to get a low flare. The unusual thing about a tunic is that you get two silhouettes in one. In one design the tunic produces a flare line, the underskirt a slim one. "Many people find this way of wearing a flare easier on the figure."

Cub Pack Planned By Hastings Church

First of 4 Meetings Set For Thursday, Feb. 19

Formation of a Boy Scout Cub Pack is being planned under the sponsorship of St. Bernard's Catholic Church, Hastings. Initial steps will be taken at a meeting Thursday, Feb. 19, at the church. This meeting will be followed by three others, all of which are designed to acquaint parents with the program's operation.

Parents of the boys to be enrolled in the pack will be required to attend the sessions as a condition of their son's acceptance into the Cub Pack. A meeting to close the charter membership will be held at the conclusion of the orientation sessions. It is estimated that about a month will elapse between the initial meeting and the time that the boys can be received into the pack. A formal installation will be held as soon as the charter is received from the National Office of the Boy Scouts of America.

Boys between the ages of nine and 11 are eligible for membership in the Cub Pack, provided his parents attend the orientation meetings. Cubbing is a home centered program and much of the boys' work is done with the help of parents. Rev. Father Moore Herald, OSB, will be chaplain of the proposed new pack.

Bus Regulations Call for Posting Schedule Changes

Printed Schedules Must Be Available on Request

The Public Utility Commission is serving upon all bus companies an order amending Commission Bus Regulations so as to require the filing and posting of time schedules, notice of proposed changes in scheduled routes and fixing conditions under which digression from established routes is permitted.

The commission directed that carriers subject to the order may within 15 days of service of the order, file with the commission written exceptions, otherwise the order will become absolute and final.

Under the ruling, bus carriers providing scheduled service on certificated routes between fixed termini or points intermediate are required to file with the commission two copies of time schedules applicable to such service seven days prior to the effective date.

Printed time schedules and information with respect to such schedules must be made available to the public upon reasonable request.

Notice of changes in time schedules involving retiming or withdrawal of any trip or trips shall be conspicuously posted on all vehicles engaged in services affected by such changes for a period of not less than seven days prior to the effective date of the changes. The provision of this phase of the regulations will not apply to routes on which service during base periods is provided on head-
