**ORDINANCE NO. 199**  
OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF PATTON BOROUGH, CAMBRIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.  
PROVIDING FOR THE ANNEXATION TO THE BOROUGH OF PATTON OF A PLOT OF LAND IN EAST CARROLL TOWNSHIP, CAMBRIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AS HEREIN DESCRIBED.  
Be it enacted and ordained by the Borough of Patton in Council assembled and it is hereby enacted and ordained by authority of the same that in pursuance of the authority granted to the Borough of Patton in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania by the Act of May 4, 1927, P. L. 519, as reenacted, revised and amended, it is hereby provided as follows:  
Section 1. THAT WHEREAS, upon petition of a majority of all of the freeholders owning a plot or tract of land as hereinafter described in East Carroll Township, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, requesting that said plot or tract of land should be annexed or become a part of the said Borough of Patton, it is hereby enacted and ordained as follows:  
Section 2. That from and after the adoption of this ordinance, the following described plot or tract of land in East Carroll Township shall be annexed to and become a part and portion of the Borough of Patton, viz:  
Beginning at a point in the Southern boundary line of the Patton Borough and line of land of Harry Nehrig; thence along line of land of said Nehrig South 65 degrees 26 minutes East a distance of 704 feet to a point; thence South 65 degrees 26 minutes East 390 feet more or less to the West Bank of Chest Creek; thence along the West Bank of Chest Creek South a distance of 2675 feet more or less to a point in line of lands of P. C. Strittmatter and the West Bank of Chest Creek; thence along line of land of P. C. Strittmatter North 47 degrees 05 minutes West a distance of 1812 feet to a point; thence North 11 degrees 10 minutes

point; thence North 23 degrees East a distance of 161 feet to a 45 minutes East a distance of 212 feet to a point; thence South 53 degrees 30 minutes East a distance of 126 feet to a point; thence North 37 degrees 15 minutes East a distance of 714 feet to a point; thence North 35 degrees 34 minutes East a distance of 965 feet to a point in the Southern boundary of the Borough of Patton; thence along

said Southern boundary line of the Borough of Patton South 65 degrees 26 minutes East 16 feet to a point in the line of lands of Harry Nehrig and the Borough of Patton; thence along line of land of Harry Nehrig and the Borough of Patton North 24 degrees 34 minutes East a distance of 400 feet to a point and the place of beginning.  
Section 3. A map or plot of the territory so annexed to the

Borough of Patton is on file in the Office of the Borough of Patton, the Office of the County Commissioners of Cambria County and the Office of the Clerk of the Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pennsylvania.  
Section 4. All ordinances and parts of ordinances of the Borough of Patton inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.  
Section 5. If any sentence, clause or section or part of this

ordinance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality, or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, or sections or parts of this ordinance. It is hereby declared as the intent of Borough Council that this ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentence, clause, section, or part

thereof not been included herein. Ordained and enacted into an ordinance the 29th day of June, 1948.

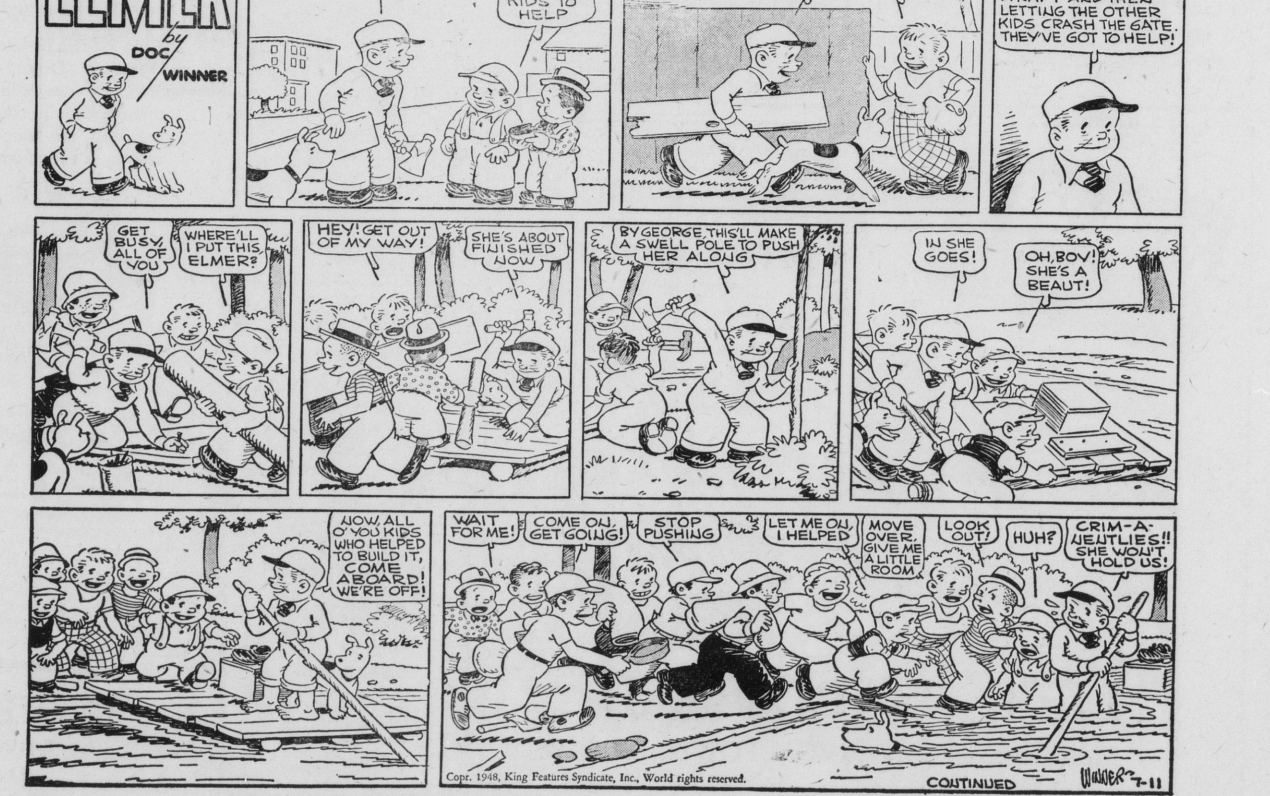
