'Chick' McCombie Making Good As Farm Team Hurler

Bakerton Young Man Fans 8 In Succession

Charles McCombie of Bakerton is rapidly becoming the No. 1 nemesia of Pony League batters. McCombie, former Carrolltown High School athlete, already lists two no-hitters and a new strike-out record among his accomplishments of the 1948 season.

While hurling for Hamilton, Ont., of the Class D. League, the promising 20-year-old lad whiffed 15 opponents in a single game with Lockport. Eight of the strikeouts came in succession for a new Pony League mark.

Chick, as he is known to his teammates, joined Hamilton at the beginning of last season after making an impressive showing at the St. Louis Cardinals try-out school at the end of the 1946 campaign.

Like most of young pitchers just starting up the baseball ladder, McCombie was troubled by wildness. "They told me I'd kill somebody if I didn't get control so I spent a lot of time throwing at one spot. They finally let me work in relief roles near the end of the season," he explained.

McCombie finished the year with a record of nine victories and seven losses, winning mostly in relief. His strikeout showing was much more impressive as he fanned 130 batters in 105 innings.

After returning to Hamilton at the start of the present season, McCombie was transferred to Winston-Salem of the Carolina League. However, he was soon recalled by Hamilton after recording four straight victories in the South.

His overall record so far this season is nine wins and only three losses.

McCombie was a letterman in three different sports at Carrolltown High. He had done an end position on the first-string football squad.

The Bakerton youth gained his early baseball experience while playing with different independent combinations in Bakerton and Barnesboro.

Shakeups Affect Chapman, Mel Ott

Ben Chapman was dismissed as manager of the Philadelphia Phillies last Friday and Coach Allen (Dusty) Cooke was named as his temporary successor.

Chapman had been manager of the Phillies since June 30, 1945, when he succeeded Fred Fitzsimmons.

In another startling move, Mel Ott, manager of the New York Giants since 1942, was removed from his position and Leo Durocher, manager of the Brooklyn Dodgers, was signed to take over the job at New York.

Durocher was released by the Brooklyn team and Bert Shotton, who led the Dodgers to the pennant last year, was recalled to succeed Durocher. Mel Ott will remain with the Giants in another capacity.

Little Mike Little of Johnstown had his five-straight-win string as winner at Ebensburg Friday evening at fairgrounds in the weekly midget racing contests. He was defeated before 5,000 persons in a 50-lap midseason championship event.

It voted to postpone to Sept. 1, 1949, the effective date of a new rule banning competition with non-member schools employing part-time coaches. Most parochial schools do not have full-time coaches.

The action was taken after the Pennsylvania Catholic Athletic Assn. requested more time for the parochial schools to comply with the new ruling, which was to have gone into effect Sept. 1.

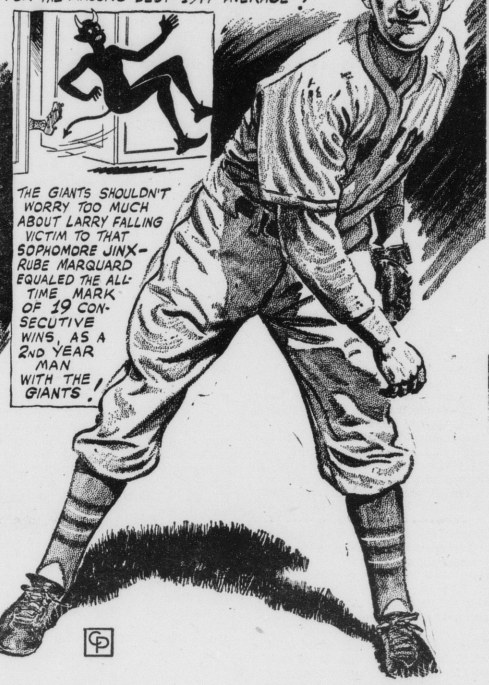
PCIAA member schools have the same eligibility rules for the most part.

Notice of Intent to Adopt a Resolution Imposing a Tax by the School District of West Carroll Township, Pennsylvania, on Coal Mined, Hauled, Dumped, etc.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the School District of West Carroll Township, Pennsylvania, acting through the duly elected members of the Board of School Directors, at a meeting held on the 12th day of July, 1948, took action looking towards the adoption of a Resolution which will be adopted at a meeting of the said School District to be held on the 9th day of August, 1948, at 8:00 o'clock P. M., at the Bakerton School Building, by the terms of which it will levy, assess and impose for general revenue purposes a tax to become effective on or after the 15th day of September, 1948, of two (2c) cents on each net ton of two thousand (2,000) pounds of bituminous coal, produced by the deep mining method, that has been mined, dumped, conveyed, placed or loaded into or onto any railroad car, steel, truck, wagon or conveyance of any kind within the limits of the said Township of West Carroll, County of Cambria and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and a tax of eight (8c) cents on each net ton of two thousand (2,000) pounds of bituminous coal, produced by the strip mine or open pit method, that has been mined, dumped, conveyed, placed or loaded into or onto any railroad car, steel, truck, wagon or conveyance of any kind within the limits of the said Township of West Carroll.

The Resolution will also provide for the appointment of a Collector of said tax, penalties for its enforcement and other necessary provisions.
