Of that, \$57,774,000 was for roads in rural areas; \$12,295,000 for urban roads, and only \$2,765,000 was for rights-of-way.

The one-half cent refund from the gasoline tax to the counties is presumed to take care of these damages, but in Cambria Co. the money simply will not stretch in any conceivable way. Bonded road debts of the past and excessively heavy damages on presently authorized roads even now compel the county commissioners to dip into the County's General Fund to meet current obligations; and to some extent this must continue for the next couple of years. Whether they know it or not, Cambria Countians are paying more taxes on highways than are most of their neighbor counties.


