Mr. and Mrs. Eddie McCully and sons motored to Beaver Falls to visit his sister, Mrs. Dan Laullamant.

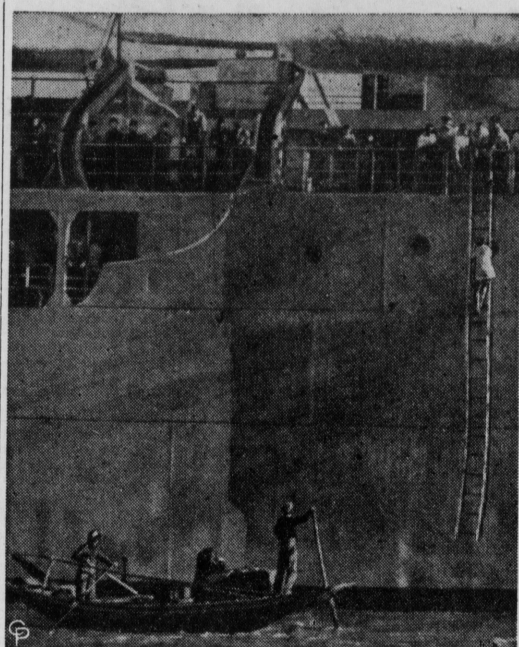

Inaugural Hot Dog 15c; No Gouging, President Informed

Big, 10-Ounce Cups Coffee Will Be Served
President Harry Truman has won one battle in his fight against inflation. The price of the inauguration hot dog in Washington has been pegged at 15c. And there'll be a big (10-oz.) cup of coffee for the same price. The President has requested that prices be kept as low as possible and the concessions committee has promised that everybody would be able to afford to take nourishment while watching the Jan. 20 goings-on.

Want Money's Worth
"There'll be no gouging by any concessionaires over whom we have jurisdiction," the committee spokesman said. "Not only will their prices be reasonable, but the public's going to get its money's worth."
Thus the 10-ounce cup of coffee. The committee feels the smaller standard cup would be just a teaser on what probably will be a cold day. And it's going to ask the vendors to make a special effort to keep the coffee hot. Sandwich prices will vary according to their contents. The run-of-mill type spawned in baseball stadia and prize fight halls—a thin wafer of cheese between two pallid slices of bread—will bring no more than a dime. Other more substantial offerings like roast beef and ham with fixings will sell for 15c.
Ingenuity Encouraged
At the same time, vendors will be encouraged to use their imagination. Anyone with the blueprint for a whopper of a sandwich will be given a fair hearing on the question of price.
