**Sgt. Preston Hill, 23, Loses Life in Italy**

S/Sgt. Preston J. Hill, 23-year-old son of John and Della (Gardner) Hill of Colver, was reburied last Saturday afternoon in Colver.

Sgt. Hill lost his life Mar. 2, 1945, in Italy while on his 41st mission with the 15th Army Air Force. He was a native of Colver and entered the service in 1942 and served a year in Alaska before returning to the states for additional reassignment. He held both the Air Medal and the Presidential Unit Citation.

He is survived by his parents and the following brothers and sisters: Telford of Cambria Twp.; Mrs. Wilda Hildebrand of Ebensburg; Glenn, with the U. S.
