

"You can't stop gambling," said Judge John H. McCann last Wednesday, "It's human nature. I've seen crusades come and go." Without refering directly to the current slot machine publicity, Judge McCann dismissed his criminal court jurors with some comments on gambling.

"Poker and bridge games will go on. Life itself is a gamble. The greatest gamble is insurance. They bet you won't die, and you've got to die to collect."
