State Embarking On Huge Program

The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania during the past week embarked on its biggest two-year spending in history with a record \$1,087,811,000 scheduled for outlay from state coffers.

Never before have state expenditures lapped over the billion dollar mark during a two-year fiscal period.

Gov. James Duff approved appropriations totaling \$746,819,619 or \$29,911,000 more than he had recommended for general government purposes in his budget recommendation in February.

In addition, the penny boost in state gasoline tax which went into effect June 1 is expected to substantially increase the amount in the state motor fund.

Co. Medical Group Gives Support To Welfare Plan

Liaison Committee to Meet District Physician

The Cambria Co. Medical Society is the most recent group in this area to place its stamp of approval on the medical, health and hospital program of the UMWA.

In addition, the county medicals have taken a concrete step to aid the success of the plan. They have appointed a liaison committee which will work in hand with health and welfare fund officials in District 2.

Dr. C. R. Davis of Johnstown is chairman of the group. His aides include Dr. Francis T. Carney, Johnstown, president of the county society; Dr. A. W. Fees, Spangler; Dr. H. A. Slesinger, Windber, and Dr. Joseph C. Anderson, Ebensburg.


According to Dr. Davis, the society has accepted the UMWA program as proposed to date.
