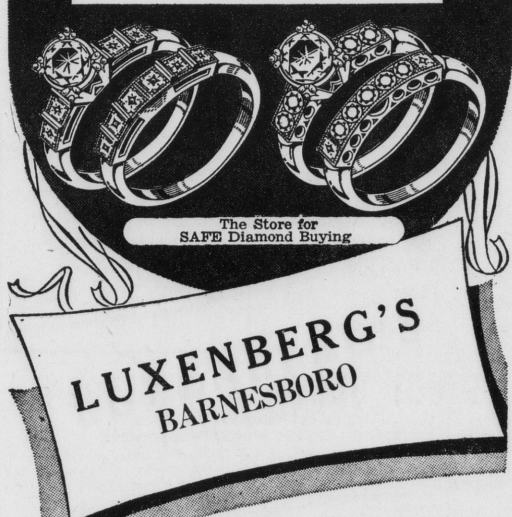

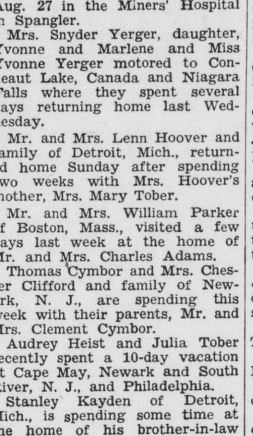

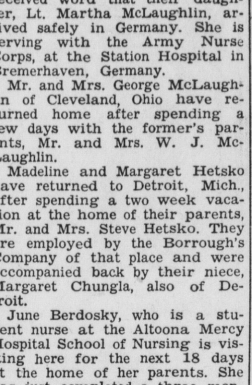

Forney, who formerly resided in Altoona, was a member of the Patton High School Band for four years. He graduated from PHS this spring and later was commissioned before CWO Frank Weirauch of the USAF at Bolling Field, Washington, D. C.

The Patton R. D. young man, who enlisted at the Altoona Army and Air Force Recruiting Station in the Postoffice Bldg., will take 13 weeks' basic training at San Antonio, Tex., after which he will be granted a furlough. He then will attend the Air Force Bandsman's School at Bolling Field and will be assigned to a band unit. He enlisted Aug. 22.
