The losers drove to the Red Flash's 25-yard line with only a half minute remaining and the score tied at 13-13. After three passes fell incomplete, the Eagles attempted a field goal but Joe Bezek of St. Francis broke through the line and blocked the kick. Wasleski picked up the ball and sprinted 80 yards for the winning score. Brown's conversion was an anticlimax.

The Red Flash, rating the title of "Never Say Die" scored all its points in the final chapter. Constanton crossed the goal line

for the winners in the final frame from the three-yard stripe after a long drive starting late in the third quarter. Brown kicked the extra point to tie the game at 7-7. Wargo Crosses Goal Line 4 Times for Dragons; Patton to Visit South Fork Saturday Afternoon

Patton High School lost their second straight game last Friday evening, to Barnesboro, 32-0, in a game played at Barnesboro. The Dragons of Barnesboro scored in each of the first three periods and were threatened twice by the Panthers.

Early in the contest Halfback Loves of Patton took a short pass and raced 62 yards before being knocked out of bounds only two yards from the goal line. Four plays later the Dragons took the ball on downs on the 16. Then, on the last play of the contest, a long pass from Jenkins to Loves was good for 57 yards before the ball-carrier was thrown out of bounds on the four-yard line.

Barnesboro was sparked by the pass combination of Vella to G. Wargo to account for two of the TD's. Wargo also scored two other touchdowns.

A poor punt which carried only 10 yards to the Patton 15 set up the first Dragon scoring stage. Wargo returned the kickoff 10 yards and on the next play Wargo sprinted around end to score. His placement was good. A few minutes later Barnesboro scored again when Vella heaved a 15-yard pass which Wargo carried another 15 yards to paydirt.

Hastings Breezes Past Heilwood In 40-0 Night Game Last Thursday

Hastings High School scored in every chapter to breeze past Pine Township High of Heilwood, 40-0 last Thursday evening on the Hastings gridiron.

The home team, rolling up a commanding 17-3 margin in first downs, scored once in each of the first two periods and then speeded its tempo to register four more second-half touchdowns.

Hastings gave an inkling of what was to come when it took the opening kickoff on a 60-yard march to a six-pointer. The winners piled up 250 net yards by rushing while the visitors could not only 16.
