

### State Police Warn Of Enforcement Of Ban On Sale Of Firecrackers

The sale or use of fireworks generally is prohibited in Pennsylvania, according to a warning issued this week from State Police Headquarters at Harrisburg.

"Complaints have been received concerning the use of fireworks in Pennsylvania," said Col. C. M. Wilhelm, State Police Commissioner. "A decade or more ago, unrestricted use of fireworks was responsible for many deaths and painful injuries in Pennsylvania. A law passed in 1939 prohibiting the use of fireworks, except in supervised public displays, has eliminated much unnecessary suffering. We intend to continue the strict enforcement of this law."

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### Salt Taken Before Heat Exposure Most Beneficial, State Physicians

Salt for workers in hot surroundings has been used for many years, according to a release from the Cambria County Medical Society, which states that it has now been discovered that salt taken before exposure to hot environments is of even more value than the giving of salt during or after exposure.

Plain table salt, taken before going on a job, has been recommended for workers in very hot environments by speakers at a recent meeting of the American Assn. of Industrial Physicians & Surgeons.

"The use of adequate salt intake in the normal person helps to resist the effects of heat stress. Acclimatization, occurring normally during spring and summer months, also aids the heart and blood vessels to withstand an added burden. This natural adjustment is brought about by changes in the glands of internal secretion."

### Air Force Band Enlistments Open

North Cambria high school graduates with musical ability will have an opportunity to join the U. S. Air Force bands according to an announcement made this week by M/Sgt. William L. Whitacre, Army and Air Force Recruiting Officer.

Sgt. Whitacre stated that 216 vacancies exist in various Air Force bands at bases in this country, and 1950 graduates with band experience may apply for enlistment in the Air Force.

Openings exist in the following categories: Trumpet, flute, piano, saxophone, trombone, baritone horn and bass horn. Letters of application may be completed after consulting list of Air Force Bands at the U. S. Army and U. S. Air Force Recruiting Station, 1003, Philadelphia Ave., Harrisburg.

### Bonus Payments Expected To Be Completed Aug. 1

**Saturday This Week Deadline For Filing**

With 627,656 claims already paid, the World War II Veterans Compensation Bureau this week estimated that the processing mission of the bureau will virtually be completed the latter part of July at the 1,000,000 mark.

The record will be reached in only six months' operation of the bureau, the fastest rate of any bonus-paying state. Application blanks were distributed Jan. 16 and processing began Jan. 24.

All clear claims—those whose supporting papers were complete—have been processed and paid or cleared for payment. Several hundred late-filed applications are received daily and these are processed currently. The final date for making application is July 1.

Total applications received and opened to date is 1,153,200. The potential is 1,215,000 based on Army and Navy induction figures from Pennsylvania.

The bureau's examiners are now concentrating almost entirely on "irregular" applications which contain varying discrepancies and omissions which are resolved either by the bureau itself or by checking with outside sources. These are being re-examined at

the rate of 12,000 a day. The job requires matching up supplemental information to complete the claim. All irregulars have to be handled at least twice and three or more times, resulting in delayed payment.

### Third Of Applicants Flunk Driver Tests

**Better Preparation Needed Says Wilhelm**

A report from State Police headquarters in Harrisburg this week shows that one of every three applicants for operators' licenses fail to pass the required examination.

Based on figures for this year, there were 33.9 percent of the examinations which resulted in failure. State Police conducted 59,835 tests, 20,262 of which indicated that the applicants were not yet ready to assume their responsibilities as drivers on the highways.

"It seems necessary to repeat the reminder that applicants must be better prepared when they present themselves for examination if they expect to be handed the privilege of driving," says Col. C. M. Wilhelm, State Police commissioner.

"As has been emphasized repeatedly, the tests are not difficult for the applicant who has learned to drive and is familiar with the Vehicle Code Digest received by each applicant when he obtains his learner's permit."

"While it is unfortunate that so many examinations result in failure, we will not assume the responsibility of placing poorly qualified drivers on the highways."
