
North All-Star Squad Names Listed For Game Next Week

34,796 Fishermen Visit At Paradise During '50 Season

A new record attendance of 34,796 was recorded at the nationally-famous "Fisherman's Paradise" near Bellefonte during the 1950 season which ended July 22. Of this number, 28,843 were men and boys while the remaining 5,953 were women and girls. The 1950 record topped that of 1949 by 473 more fishermen.

During the 1950 season (May 19 to July 22) some 76,197 trout were caught, of which 8,057 were killed. The largest caught by a man was a 24 1/2 brown trout tipping the scales at 112 ounces.

Some 60 fishermen were apprehended violating the rules and regulations of the Paradise. These violators were fined and barred from the Paradise for the rest of the season. In addition, they will be denied a 1951 fishing license.

Two separate streams constitute the project, one set aside for men and the other for exclusive fishing for women and children.


