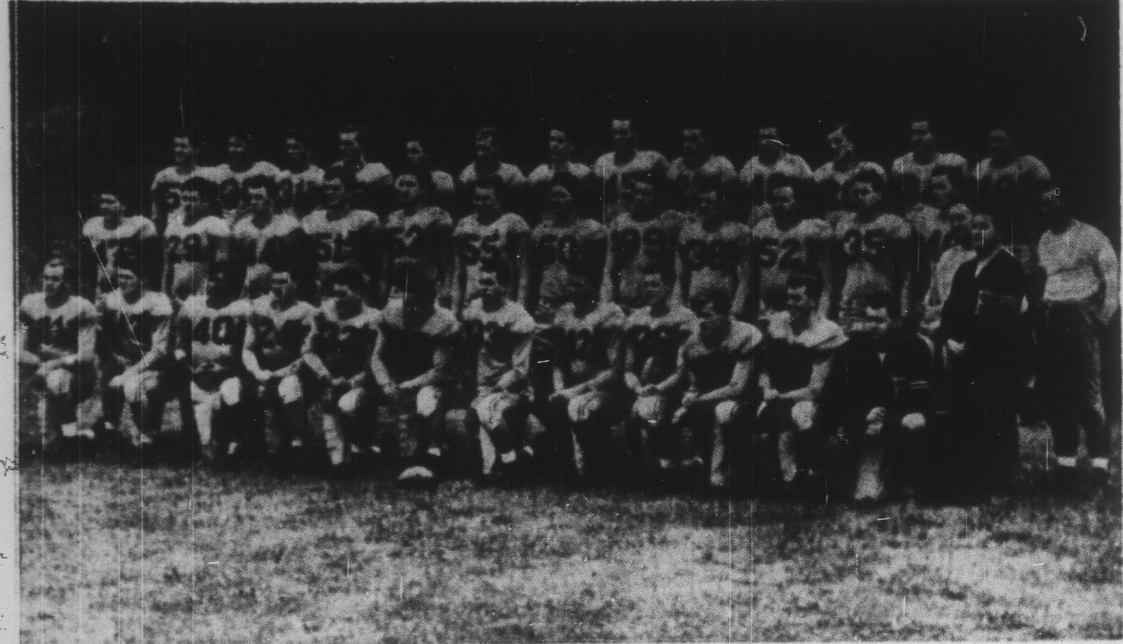

### Spangler Taps Hastings, 13-9, For Fourth Straight Victory

#### Knights Inflict Blotch On SHS Perfect Record

The Bobcats of Spangler High School downed the Hastings High Knights last Thursday night, 13-9, to chalk up their fourth straight win of the season. The unbeaten chargers of Ted Keenan, however, had their first points scored against them in the game played at Hastings. Spangler scored twice in the first quarter, once in the second and two more times in the final round as the Knights of Johnny Nevins scored a TD and safety in the second round.

Spangler drove 35 yards after recovering an enemy fumble for its first score. Baron plunged for the score and Britton hit the line for the seventh point. Later in the first stanza, Marshall scored on a 30-yard run. The winner's second-point score came on Marshall's eight-yard line buck.

Marshall ran 20 yards and then lateraled to Frontino, who recd 15 more for the first TD in the final round. Tom Ashcroft carried 32, intercepted pass 30 yards for the final six-point.

Hastings scored its TD on Bobby Weakland's 20-yard pass to Joe Anna. Kelly blocked a kick in the Spangler end zone for the safety.

Spangler held the edge in first downs, 13-5, and also led in net yardage, 235 to 139. The summary:

### Ebensburg Loses 20-0 Decision to Conemaugh Twp.

Although showing a 12-11 margin in first downs, Coach Jimmy Cook's Ebensburg-Cambria High Red Devils were defeated last Friday night, 20-0, at the hands of Conemaugh Township.

The Red Devils could get only one steady drive going, that in the final round, when they drove to the seven yard line. On the next two plays Ebensburg drove to the enemy six. Then Leroy Deola attempted to pass, but Smakula of Conemaugh Twp. intercepted and raced 96 yards for a score.

The Indians scored the first TD in the opening minutes as Smakula hit paydirt from the 2-yard line. The TD was set up as Green of Conemaugh Twp. intercepted Joe Strenko's pass and raced to the Devils 9-yard line. Lenny Pepoy scored in the second frame on a two-yard plunge to climax a 42-yard drive.

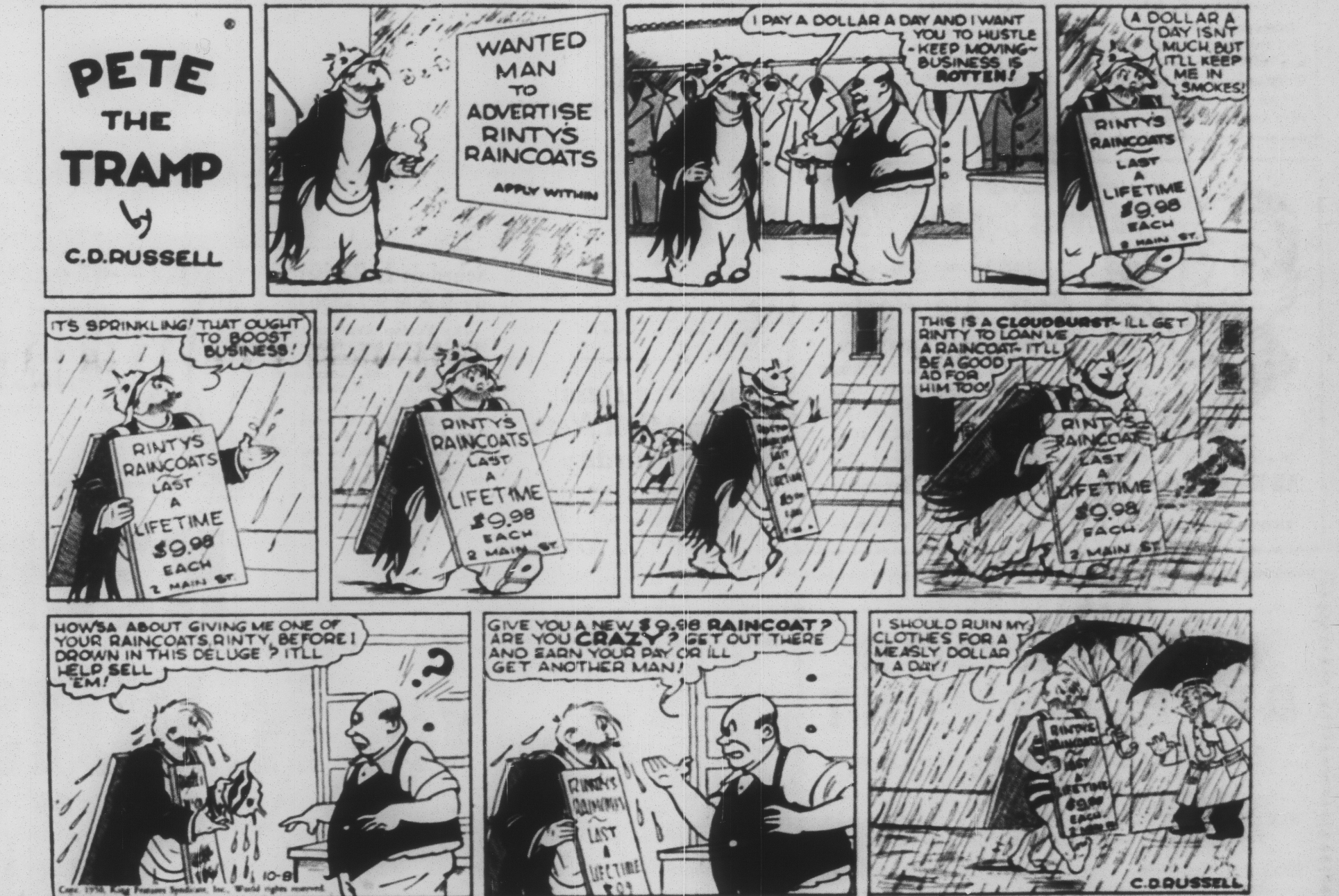
