Nearly 2 Miles of Yardage Gained By N. C. Grid Squads

Patton, Carrolltown, Hastings, Barnesboro And Spangler Varsities All Boast Good Records

Northern Cambria County high schools drove nearly two miles down the gridiron during the past season while chalking up a total of 911 points.

And according to statistics, the home teams outdid their opponents in both categories.

The five high school considerations are Patton, Carrolltown, Hastings, Spangler and Barnesboro.

Spangler was the only team to go undefeated, winning all 10 of their games and with them the Class B title for this section.

Carrolltown won 4 out of 9 games and Barnesboro won 7 out of 10. Patton won 4, lost 4, and tied 1, and Hastings won 6, lost 3 and had one tie.

Despite the fact that each of the teams has the others on its schedule, records show that out-of-section visitors must have fallen down slightly on pass defense, because North Cambria squads completed 82 of 202 passes.

Doe Season Opener Monday To Draw Throongs to Woods

Antlerless Deer Shoot To Begin At 9 A. M.

Literally thousands of "doe" hunters are expected to take to the woods for the two-day "doe" season Monday and Tuesday of next week.

Many of the men, and some women, too will be hunting in this section. But they will be exercising care not to cross into Clearfield County, where the antlerless deer season has been abrogated.

Deer are reported plentiful in the North Cambria woods, ranging even further into the open areas this year than usual.

The big exodus to the "deer camps" in northern tier counties is not expected to take place until Tuesday, for "buck" season does not open until Wednesday at 7 a. m. and most of the "deer camp" counties are closed during the same information.

Mason, Nolan Offense Leaders For St. Francis

With the completion of the 1950 football season, statistics reveal Dan Mason and Pat Nolan were the offensive leaders for the St. Francis College squad.

Mason, playing his final season for the North Cambria College, compiled a net gain of 359 yards on 57 attempts, for an average of 6.3 yards per try.

Senior quarterback Bob Graupenberger, handled most of the passing duties for the Red Flash and connected on 28 of 76 passes for a net gain of 372 yards.

Complete squad statistics show the 95 first downs to their opponents. On the ground the Loretto boys compiled 1,333 yards while holding the opposition to 863. Along the air-ways, the Red Flash quarterbacks connected on 48 of 135 passes for 697 yards.

In compiling a mediocre record of 4 wins against 4 losses, the Redskins rolled up 45 points on 22 touchdowns, 9 extra points and a safety. The opponents compiled 117 markers on 18 six-pointers and 9 extra points.

After a legal kill has been made, it must be "tagged" immediately with the tag supplied with the hunting license, or in case a bear has been killed by that individual, by a tag bearing the same information.
