Change From Overalls Prior To Wedding Here

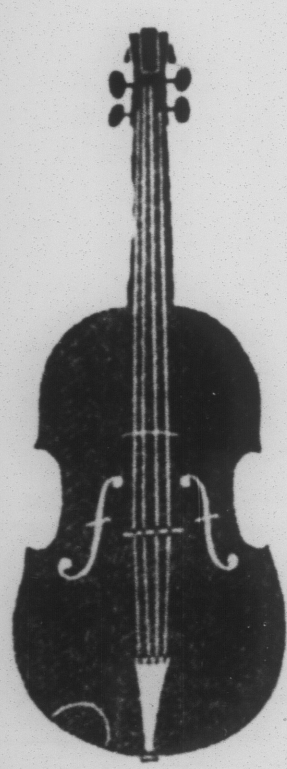

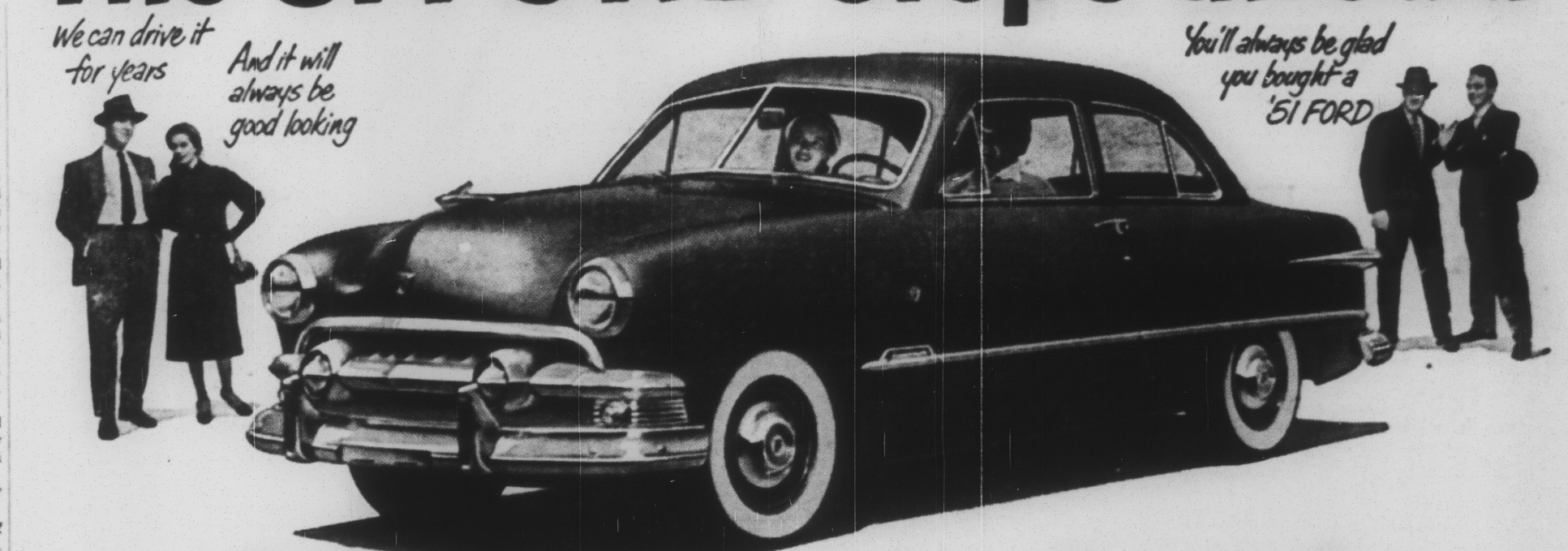

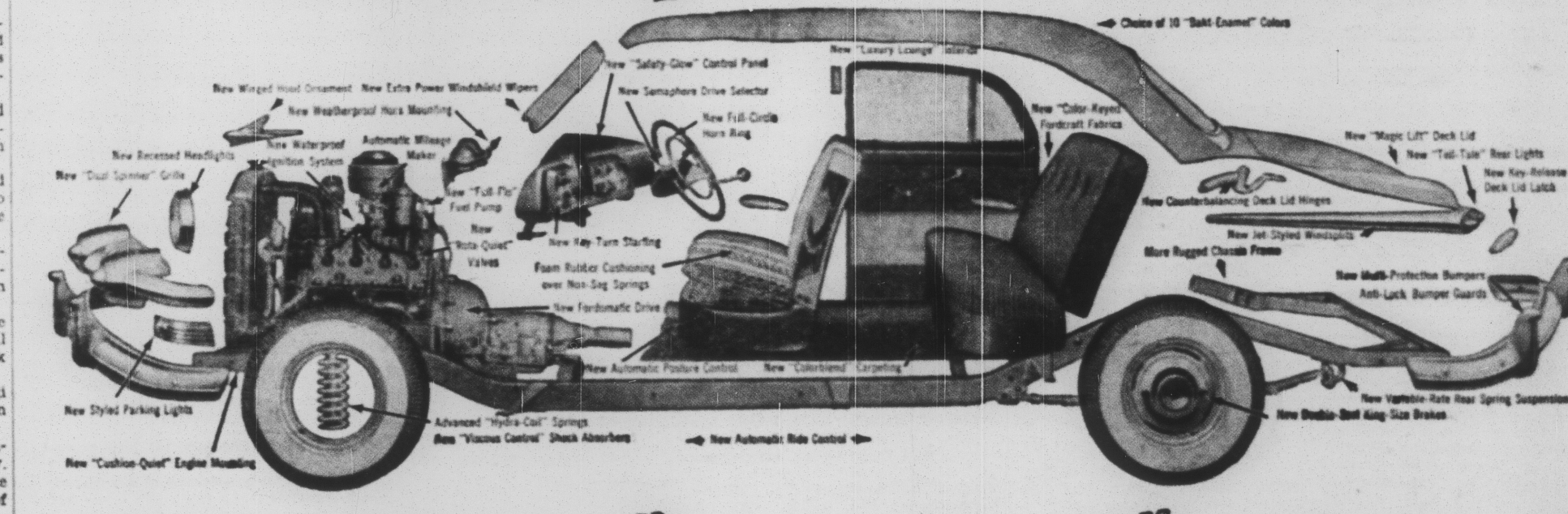
