James Cook of Ebensburg-Cambria and Vic Fusa of Indiana coached the Northern team last year. Last season's Southern team was coached by Steve Trebus of Conemaugh Township and Milan Jurich of Conemaugh.

Schools to have representatives on the Northern team are: Patton, Carrolltown, Spangler, Hastings, Barnesboro, Ebensburg-Cambria, Gallitzin, Cresson, Lilly, South Fork, Beaverdale, Portage, Black Lick, Adams Township, Saxton-Liberty, Altoona, Tyrone, Williamsburg, Bellwood-Antis, Claysburg, Roaring Spring, Hollidaysburg, Indiana, Homer City and Green Township.

The Southern team will be made up of players from these schools: Johnstown, Conemaugh, Franklin, Richland Township, Westmont, Dale, Somerset, Boswell, Ferndale, Windber, Conemaugh Township, Southmont, Berlin, Bedford, Meyersdale, New Florence, Everett, Johnstown Catholic, Armstrong and Shade Twp. Teams to play in the Association's game will be made up of representatives from the above named schools which embrace the West-Central District. Individual players will be boys who were seniors in the 1935 squads of their respective schools.
