Party At Hastings Will Benefit Playground Fund

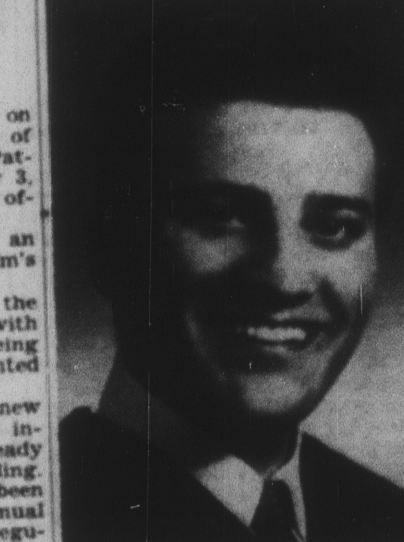
