

Official Ballot Count Shows No Changes In Nominees

Judge Ivan J. McKenrick Makes Public Official County Figures

The official count of ballots cast in the July 24 primary election shows only minor changes in the unofficial totals cast for candidates in Cambria County.

There were no changes in the results.

In the closest race for a nomination Attorney Albert L. O'Connor defeated Judge John H. McCann by 825 votes for the Republican nomination for judge of the court of common pleas. Judge George W. Griffith is the other Republican nominee. Judges Mc-

Cann and Griffith won the Democratic nominations by wide margins.

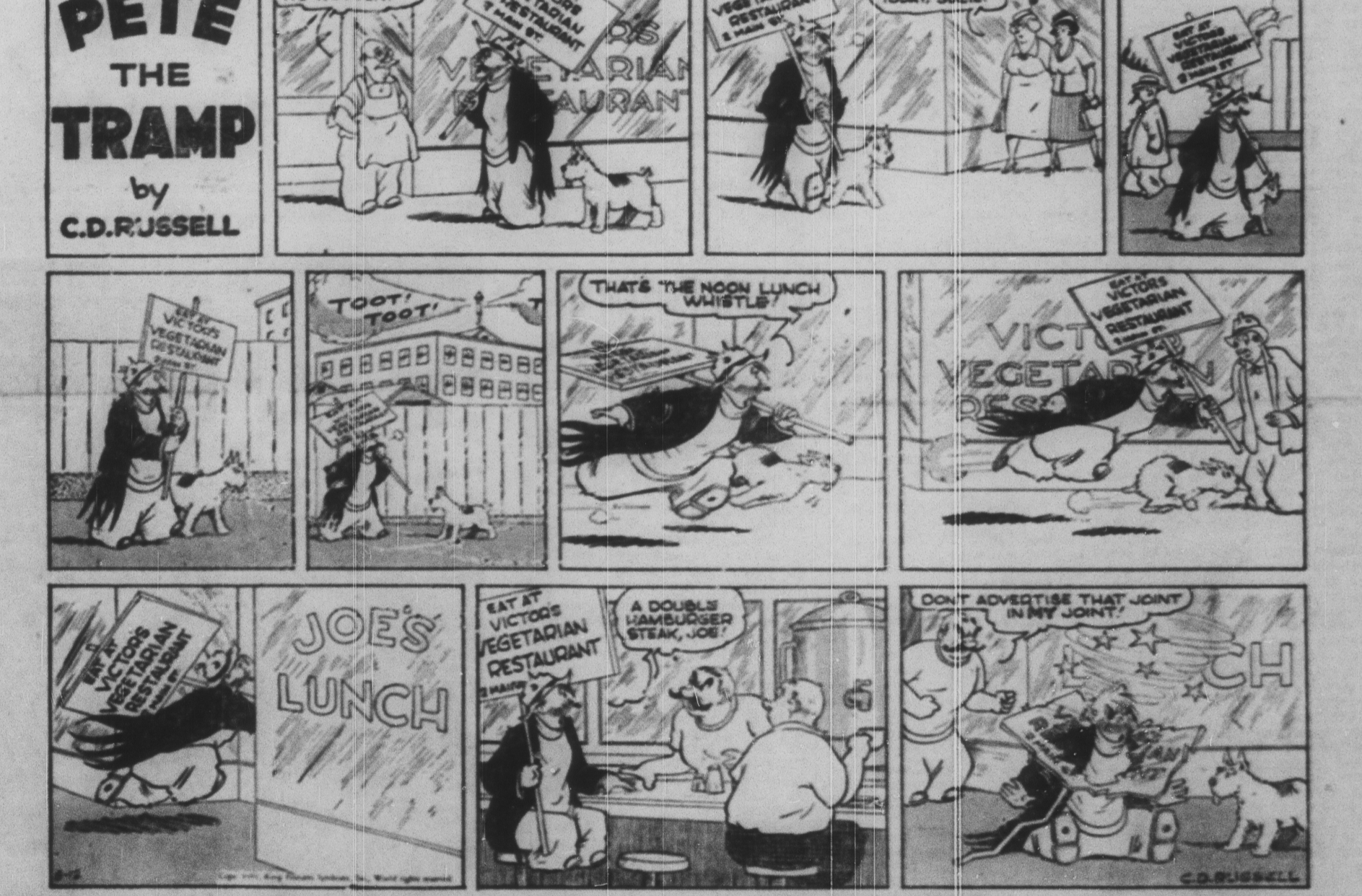
