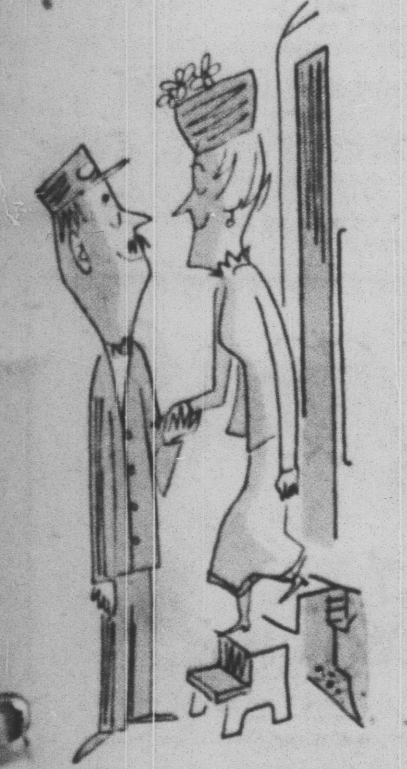


PARTY AT ST. BONIFACE
