Gallitzin GI Home With Japanese Bride of 5 Months

A 22-year-old Gallitzin soldier returned to the States from the Far East last Thursday, accompanied by his Japanese bride of five months.

Aboard the returning navy transport, which arrived in Seattle, Wash., were Cpl. James E. Kilmartin of Gallitzin, and his wife, the former Josephine Lilly Baker of Ashiya, Osaka, Japan.

Cpl. Kilmartin is back on his native soil after nearly 2 1/2 years overseas. His wife is seeing the United States for the first time.

The couple was married last May 1 in a military cathedral in Osaka by Rev. Father Thomas Pennell, pastor of Sacred Heart Catholic Church, Osaka.

Although a native of Japan,

Mrs. Kilmartin is of English descent. During World War II, she and her parents were sent to the British colony in Hong Kong, China.

Prior to leaving her native land, Mrs. Kilmartin was secretary to the manager of United States steamship lines in Osaka. She is a graduate of Sacred Heart Convent in Tokyo.

The Gallitzin GI enlisted in the army Oct. 3, 1948, after attending St. Francis College, Loretto, for one year.

He was sent overseas in May, 1949, as assistant to the head chaplain in Japan.

Cpl. Kilmartin was transferred to Korea July 9, 1950, as a member of the historian's office of the 25th Infantry Division. He was assigned to aid in collecting historical data about the Korean campaign.

The war bride will make her home with her husband's mother, Mrs. Jane G. Kilmartin of 815 North Main St., Gallitzin, until he completes another year's service with the army.
