Parcel Post Limit Cut By New Law

Congress last Thursday passed a bill cutting the size and weight limits on some parcel post packages.

Both the Senate and the House approved a compromise measure sending it to President Truman.

The bill limits parcels handled by first-class postoffices, in large cities to not more than 40 pounds in weight, and 72 inches combined length and girth.

Present size and weight limits—70 pounds and 100 inches—are unchanged for parcels mailed to or from smaller postoffices.

Also exempted from the new limits are parcels mailed to or from army or navy postoffices, to or from postoffices in the territories or possessions, and parcels containing baby chickens, live plants, trees, agricultural commodities and books that don't contain advertising.
