Paul McConnell: "It's just the right size town."

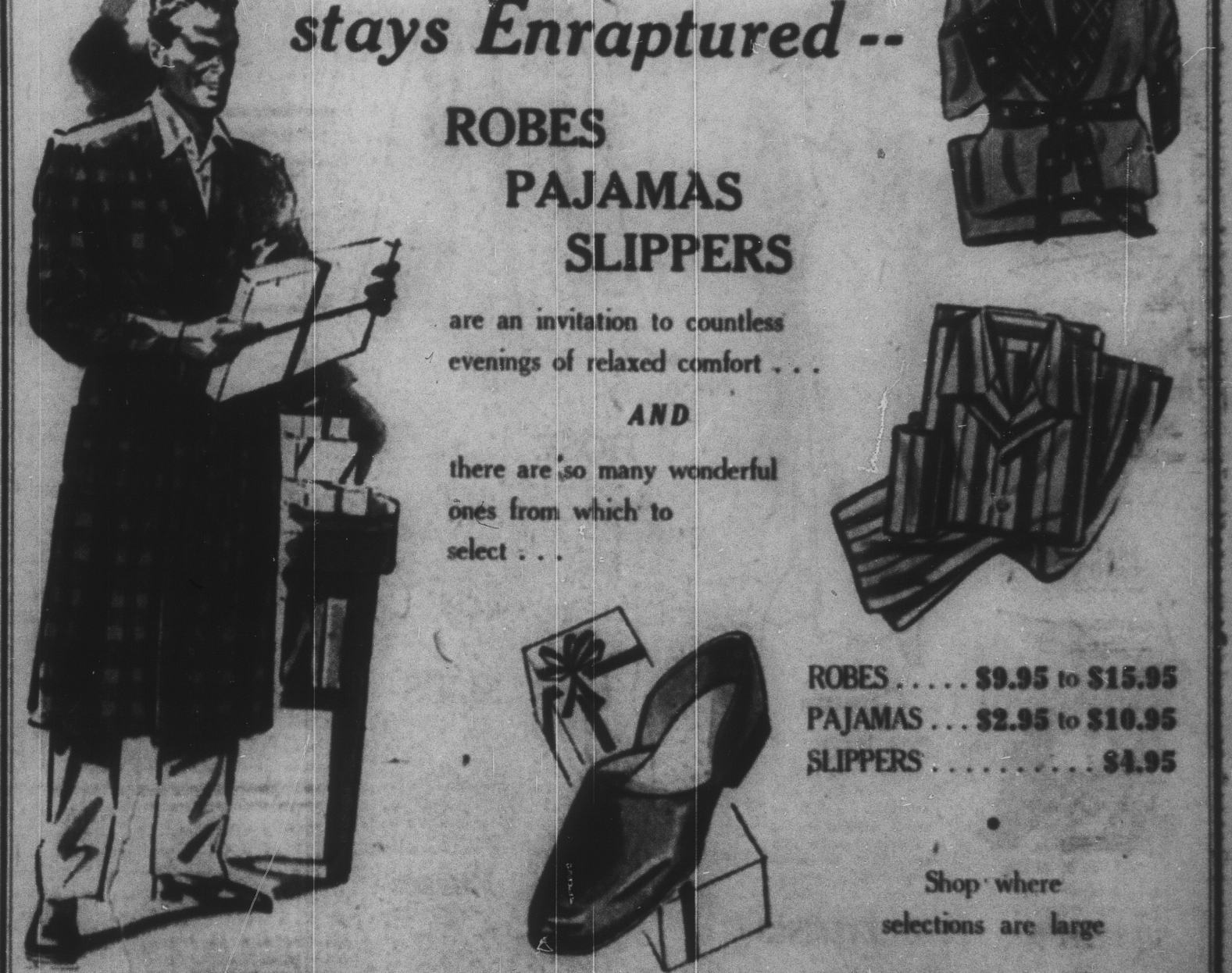
