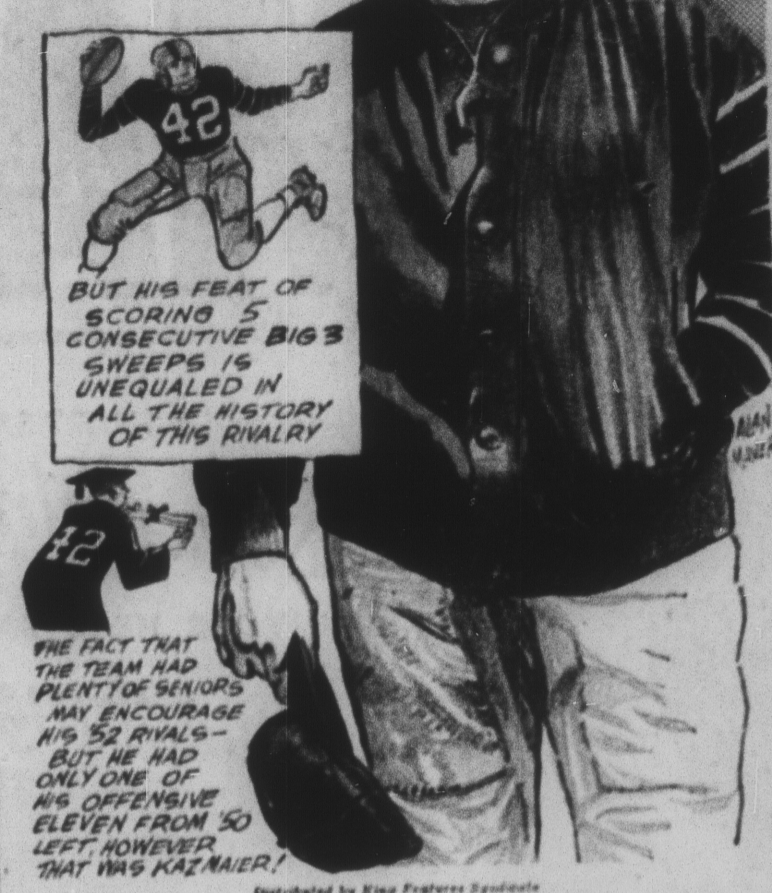

Trouble Seen As Looming For Defending Cage Champs

Trouble is in store for Pennsylvania's defending schoolboy basketball champions as the new campaign gets under way with a month of non-league games.

Graduation thinned the ranks of many of last spring's kingpins, leaving most of their runners-up in stronger position.

Allentown, the defending PIAA Class A state champion, has only six-foot Leroy Katz from its title-winning regulars and only two other returning lettermen.

The state champions have one of the rugged exhibition schedules in the state as well as a full slate of games in the strong East Penn Conference. Non-League games are coming up with Kutztown, the PIAA Class B champion; Norristown and Pottsville of District 1; Swoyersville the Eastern runner-up; and Reading Central Catholic, Co-PCIAA Class A champion.

Farrell, the Western Class A winner which lost to Allentown 66-55, is little better off. The Steelers have all-starer Julius McCoy and guard Ronnie Crosby back from last spring. Minus McCoy, who was injured in the WPIAL football playoff, Farrell's contender is a Ford City with a 45-37 win over Tronto, Ohio.

Swoyersville, Eastern runner-up last spring and regional champion the year before, again is a favorite in the east with six-foot-five Joe Holup, all-state center, sparking a strong entry.

Pittsburgh Westinghouse, second to Farrell in the West, also is expected to be another strong entry in the Ford City, which lost the WPIAL title to Farrell last spring, 61-60. Ford City opened last Tuesday with a 60-46 win over Clairton.

Johnstown Catholic and Reading Catholic, co-champions of the state Catholic schools, also have been hard-hit by graduation. The Reading team is minus its all-starer Mike DePaul while Johnstown has only one letterman.

The Johnstown team had their 32-game win streak snapped last Saturday when St. James of Pittsburgh won the opener for both schools, 56-48. It was the latter team's 40th straight win.

Kutztown, the PIAA Class B champion for the past two seasons, has lost little all-starer Ron Weidenhammer and was defeated last Friday night by Pottstown, 54-46.

Maurice Stokes, 6-5 negro center for the Frankies, was the game's high scorer with 32 points on 13 field goals and six fouls.

In Sunday's game, George Banachansky was the big gun for St. Francis with 21 points. Ed Sharrick was right behind with 18, as Stokes hit for 12 points. Maciarowski collected 14 for Kings.

The Red Flames piled up scoring margins in every period, beginning with a 17-11 edge in the first and progressing with 21-16, 22-14 and 20-14 scores.

St. Francis now has a 3-2 record. They will play Ft. Monmouth this Friday and St. Peter's Saturday, on a two-day New Jersey trip.
