

26 Killed, 423 Injured Is Toll On Cambria Roads for 1951

\$300,000.00 Damage Caused By Accidents

Twenty-six persons were killed, 423 were injured and property damage totaled \$300,000.00 on Cambria County roads during the past 12 months. The figures, establishing several new high marks, were released by Sgt. Elmer Schroyer, officer in charge of the state police detail in Ebensburg.

The 1951 report includes only those accidents outside city or town limits which occurred in boroughs where local police investigated are not included in the annual toll.

During the past 12 months, the frequency of accidents increased 27 percent above the previous all-time high. The number of cars involved was 816, which is 22 percent higher than it was before.

The 423 persons that were injured represent a gain of 18 percent above the previous record of 357 established in 1948.

Damage to autos and other vehicles, as well as property, was estimated at \$288,156. This is 70 percent more than the previous record of \$169,000 which was set in '49.

Only in the death column did the 1951 toll fail to exceed the previous record, although the number of fatalities ran a close second to the all-time high.

Twenty-six persons were killed in 24 accidents on county high-

ways during the year. This is just a little less than the record high of 27 in 1949.

Eight of this year's victims were driving their own vehicles. Nine others were pedestrians, two were bicyclists and seven were occupants of cars driven by other persons.

In all state police of Ebensburg investigated 445 accidents during the year. This is 96 above the previous record. Nearly half of the crashes were attributed to excessive speed.

The investigation of accidents represents only a part of the work done on district highways by state police during the past year.

Sgt. Schroyer said that during the year 940 motorists or drivers were arrested for motor vehicle violations. Ninety of these were prosecuted on drunken driving charges. Police also recovered 14 stolen cars with a combined value of \$18,450.

In addition, the Ebensburg station reported above that 372 miscellaneous investigations were made and 491 criminal complaints were received during the past 12 months. The latter resulted in 239 criminal arrests and recovery of stolen property valued at \$7,291.

The steady increase of work in the traffic department started in 1946 when war-time travel restrictions were removed. In 1945 only 483 accidents were reported to state police in Ebensburg and within two years this figure had more than doubled.

Memorial Services Held At Gallitzin

Memorial services were held in Gallitzin high school Monday evening of last week by the Gallitzin High School Alumni Association for an alumnae killed in action in Korea.

The services were held for Paul Rocus, 22-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. John G. Rocus, who was killed Jan. 9, 1951, while serving with an infantry unit.

It was agreed to buy a plaque for the championship team of the 1951 St. Francis College high school basketball tournament and to buy lights for the high school's trophy case.

Jeanne Helman was appointed to head a committee to keep a record of deceased alumni. Dorothy Hysong reported on the group's Christmas party. Three directors will be elected at a session Monday, Feb. 1.
