School Boards Will See Oaths Taken

The State Public Instruction Dept. this week reminded local school districts throughout the state that he will have the responsibility of carrying out provisions of the recently enacted Loyalty Oath Bill.

Sometime between Mar. 1 and Apr. 1, all persons coming under the act—including state and local governmental workers and 60,000 public school teachers—will be required to take oaths of allegiance to the government of the United States and of this state.

Dr. Francis E. Haas, state superintendent of public instruction, emphasized that under the act, which had a stormy trip through the Legislature, local school boards—and not his department—have primary responsibility under a clause which places the burden on "appointing authorities."
