3 of 5 County Fee Offices Show Credited Profit for '51 Branch Chairmen

Register's, Sheriff's Office Show Deficit

Cash collections made by Cambria County's five fee offices amounted to \$106,207 during the past year. The fee offices are those of the prothonotary, recorder of deeds, register of wills, sheriff and clerk of courts.

The cash income was about

The cash income was about \$19,000 less than the fee offices spent last year, but on the records they are credited with a \$17,000

The cash deficit is more than offset by the office credits applied. These are credits allowed for work done for the county. The fee offices receive no cash payments for work done for the county, but are credited on paper with the same amount of income they would have received had the work been done for a private individual or company.

The paper credits during the year amounted to \$36,707 to more than offset the \$19,000 cash defeit. The \$106,207 in cash collections was about \$6,000 above the previous year's total.

The offices of the prothonotary and recorder of deeds aboved cash seofits without using office credits. The offices of the register of wills and sheriff showed losses was after office credits were added to cash income. The clerk of courts office reported a cash loss


