GROW MORE FEED

A poor growing season this year could put a drastic squeeze on feed, says William Johnston, Penn State agricultural economist. A few dollars spent on pasture fertilization, improved hay handling or other practices, can trim the feed bill considerably.

HAVE MACHINERY READY

All needed repairs should be made on farm machinery before the implements go into the field, remind Penn State extension agricultural engineers. Time will be saved when it counts most. There also is a safety angle. A break-

down in the field may result in an injury or death.
